

## MISSION STATEMENT

"We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve."

The Communal Penance Service is from 5:30 – 7 PM this MONDAY evening. We will have soup and chili as usual for penitents and confessors alike to consume as soon as you are done with confession. Somehow it is consoling to admit our sinfulness and to be absolved along with others, as it is to celebrate being absolved with others as well. We are all sinners, and one of the things that Jesus does is allow us to admit our sins with the confidence that He can not only forgive us but integrate our sins into our lives as we go forward. We don't have to deny anything; we don't have to justify ourselves; we don't have to completely undo the damage we have done (this is rarely possible). Christ allows us to repent and move forward in faith. Repentance provides an occasion to experience, then understand more deeply the God's Merciful Love. There is joy in knowing that we are forgiven. C.S. Lewis puts it this way:

It may be that salvation consists not in the cancelling of these eternal moments [of sin] but in the perfected humility that bears the shame forever, rejoicing in the occasion which it furnished to God's compassion and glad that it should be common knowledge to the universe. Perhaps in that eternal moment St. Peter—he will forgive me if I am wrong—forever denies his master. If so, it would indeed be true that the joys of heaven are for the most of us, in our present condition, an acquired taste"—and certain ways of life may render the taste impossible of acquisition.

Perhaps the lost are those who dare not go to such a public place. (*The Problem of Pain*, pp 49-50)

So come and experience the Redemptive, Merciful Love of our Lord Monday evening!

I had hoped to distribute Communion under the species of both bread AND wine. But as I think about it, we will have extra people here whom we cannot catechize regarding receiving from the cup; there are sicknesses still going around; and we have to have the Extraordinary Ministers to do this correctly, since the number will double for each Mass. So it seems prudent to wait until a little later. I am interested in how you feel about this issue. Please let us know via Flocknote (answer the survey) or tell us personally or call the office.

When we do begin again to distribute the Precious Blood, we expect people to take a small sip, not much more than wetting their lips. The Lord is present totally in one drop, as He is in one small particle, of communion, and that is the point of receiving the Lord.

Let us continue to prepare for Easter and the Resurrection!

The book Holy Moments and the related Best Lent Ever daily videos have really been inspiring. The concept is pretty simple, we should ask God each day how he wants us to collaborate with him to be like Jesus to our community. There are even daily prompts with suggestions of how to do this. If you would like to check it out, there is a link to join the Flocknote group on our website.

Whether you want to get the daily videos or not, I challenge everyone reading this to serve God by welcoming people to Mass. This is not just the role of our wonderful Greeters and Ushers, we need everyone in the congregation to be welcoming. I know many of you already are, my family was warmly welcomed by several parishioners when



we moved here a few years ago. I am grateful for this vibrant parish, but there is always room for improvement. Palm Sunday and Easter usually increase our Mass attendance. This is one of the times of year when people make attending Mass a priority. It is our job to make everyone feel like they belong here, because they do, so please welcome them!

In a training I watched recently, I learned that the majority of people who leave the Catholic Church do so not because they don't agree with the teachings, but because when they stopped attending weekly, no one seemed to notice or care. How sad is that? So how do we make them feel like they belong here? Of course I have suggestions:

- As you choose where to sit, move to the middle of the pew if you can, so that if someone comes looking for a seat, they do not have to ask you move over. That is a very awkward and uncomfortable situation.
- Think about people you used to see in Mass, that you haven't seen for a long time. Call and invite them to celebrate Mass with you. Spring is coming (supposedly), some of our older parishioners may be ready to get out again, offer them a ride to church.
- Expect to see faces in the congregation that you don't see every week. Make them feel like if they don't come the next week, they will be missed. Simply say "I'm happy you are here. Hope to see you again soon."
- Finally the best suggestion is always to collaborate with God by asking how he wants you to serve him each day. The more people in our parish who do this, the more full of Holy Moments our community will be.

# Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) Corner:

#### PRAYING WITH YOUNG CHILDREN

If prayer is response, what is the starting point that invites the child to respond? It can be naming God as the one who brought everything into being, declaring God's unending love, telling the child about Jesus' birth, or explaining that he died but is risen. We usually need to speak only a few words. The very slightest suggestion of the mystery of God, spoken with reverence, often stirs the heart of a young child.

Their response is in their listening, their gratification, their joy, and sometimes in their request that you "say it again." We may notice that children "lift their voices" in prayer, and so music becomes a way to assist them. We can listen in church for songs that address God directly or for antiphons and alleluias that are easy to sing. Just a line or two will do for the child.




