MISSION STATEMENT

"We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve." I will be gone taking a little break this weekend through Wednesday. It has been a busy, fruitful, and tiring Easter season, and I am ready to get away for a few days. I should be back in action on Thursday morning. Msgr. Gaalaas will be covering for me, and he really enjoys coming here to help. Please make him feel welcome.

Next weekend we will be the weekend of blessings: 1) Blessing of the Child in the Womb and 2) Blessing of our Graduates (8th and 12th graders, especially). We will also begin offering the Blessed Sacrament under the species of BOTH bread AND wine, not just bread as we have been doing since COVID. So we will do some training at Mass, and next week's bulletin will contain directions on how to receive communion, especially with the cup. Remember, some in our parish have never received from the cup, and their training can serve as a review of what the rest of us should be doing. We will start with just two cups until we ascertain how many will want to receive from the cup. Please be patient as we find the people and the routines that work best.

Last Summer we closed the office at 3 PM M – Th during weekdays, and it gave the employees a break. Parishioners easily adjusted to the summer schedule. So we plan to do the same this summer. Beginning on May 30^{th} (Monday, May 29^{th} is Memorial Day) until August 9^{th} we will have summer hours, then on August 9^{th} we will return to our 8 – 5 hours. So to summarize, from May 30^{th} through August 8^{th} , the office will be open from 8 – 3 M-Th with lunch hour from 12 – 1 PM, with Fridays 8 – 12:30 pm.

I would like to highlight something that is discussed in the second reading: the priesthood of the baptized. What does this mean? Well, originally, when God called the Jews into the desert from Egypt to form a chosen people, all 12 tribes were capable of offering sacrifices. In other words, they were all priests. When they worshipped the golden calf while waiting for Moses to come down from Sinai, God took away that privilege and appointed only one tribe to be priests, the Levites from the tribe of Levi. So God intended that all share in the priesthood, all would offer sacrifices. Because of their misbehavior, it did not work out.

Now in the New Covenant, that privilege has returned to those who are baptized. We who are baptized become "a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people of his own." So each of the "living stones" is capable of offering a pleasing sacrifice to God, to offer their spiritual sacrifices to God. How is this done? At the Eucharist. At the Eucharist, Christ's sacrifice on Calvary is offered to the Father. It is the ONLY sacrifice pleasing to the Father, and in the Eucharist that sacrifice is made present to us, and we who are baptized participate in it. This is not the same as my ordained priesthood – that is a special calling which makes possible the Eucharist in which all baptized persons participate. But if you are baptized, you have the capacity to unite your spiritual sacrifices with the Perfect Sacrifice of Christ. That is only possible because you are part of the Body of Christ, you are baptized. At Mass you should seek to 1) Offer your spiritual sacrifices to God, to put those mentally on the altar; 2) God Accepts them just as the priest accepts the bread and wine in the name of Christ and puts them on the altar; 3) God transforms your offerings just as He transforms the bread into his Body and the wine into his Blood; and 4) God gives us back our offering, now transformed, at Communion. God will not be outdone in generosity. Those are the four steps of a sacrifice, and in the Eucharist we enter into the Perfect Sacrifice on Calvary. Do you see why the Eucharist is considered the greatest prayer we can say or celebrate? If you understand how Mass is a sacrifice and how to enter into it, and take the time to make your offering to God every Sunday or every day at Mass, you will grow closer to Jesus. Let us allow Christ to unite us into one in His Body and through celebrating the Eucharist. It is a joy to celebrate Eucharist with you.

Mystic Minutes—Stony Hearts and God's Love—by Jacob Struemph

"God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham" (Luke 3:8). The Lord gave me to know something more about Him this past weekend. As I was sitting in Jesus' Eucharistic presence, the above verse came to me. I've gotten to know my heart a little more clearly over the past few years and let me tell you something... It's a lot more cold, hard, and indifferent to God's love than I would have expected. It's the reality of our broken human condition. I'm seeing things more clearly in God's

light. Here's the bright side, the very bright side:

God stands at the door of our hearts and knocks (see Rev 3:20). Even if we are like the Pharisees—the religious leaders of Jesus' time who were often hardened against God, self-righteous, harsh, and judgmental—God can and will transform our hearts of stone and raise us up into real children of God if only we let Him enter. Whether we're the worst sinner in the world or if we've never committed a single grave sin, He's only concerned with loving us... A LOT. He literally created us to lavish us with His love forever—God the Holy Trinity of love dancing in our souls... Our dignity is so high. No matter our past up until this point, He will raise us up to a very high degree of heavenly glory if only we sit and receive this from Him. God only needs one small crack for His mercy to accomplish the rest in us. Hang out with Jesus in the Eucharist. It's a recipe for making saints out of stony hearts. He's in the tabernacle, and I don't think He wants to be all alone in there. Sit and receive... and see what happens.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) Corner:

The Risen Life of Jesus shared with us in the Eucharist

In the Church we continue to be nourished by the best food and best drink, the Body and Blood of the Good Shepherd who is truly present with us in the Eucharist. One of the Atrium materials particularly enjoyed by the 3-6 and 6-9 children is called the Eucharistic Presence of the Good Shepherd. In this material we ponder the connection between the Scriptural parable of the Good Shepherd who gives all of himself to his sheep and the liturgical celebration of this reality in which we, his sheep, are fed by the very best food and drink when we are fed by the Eucharist and, thus, receive and grow in the Risen Life of Jesus, our Good Shepherd. Often, adults are surprised to hear that it is the Risen Life of Christ that we receive and enjoy in the Eucharist. And yet for the children, this is a truth that has resonated from the earliest days of their time in the Atrium. This intrinsic connection between Scripture and Liturgy, Resurrection and Eucharist, can be seen in a very particular way through their artwork. Here are a few examples of "Alleluias" decorated just before the beginning of the Lenten season. It is beautiful to see the synthesis in these illustrations (just two of many similar pieces of art) which reveals the deep truth of the Eucharist recognized by children and, we hope, by adults as well!


