MISSION STATEMENT

“We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in
Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve.”

Advent is upon already us, though briefly – this year is the shortest Advent that we can have, since Christmas comes the Monday after the Fourth Sunday of Advent. Culturally, we hear Christmas music and see Christmas decorations even before Thanksgiving, so Advent is pretty much swallowed up by the great event we call Christmas. But the fact remains: Christmas is so great an event that we need to prepare for it! Objectively, Christmas will come and go, but subjectively the incarnation is sooooo great a mystery, that we cannot possibly take in its total significance, cannot possibly understand the depths of the mystery of our God – all knowing, all powerful, our Creator, our Redeemer – who humbles himself to become a human being. So Advent is an attempt to say that we need to prepare ourselves to enter more deeply into the mystery of the incarnation. Each year I think of new consequences, understand the mystery more deeply, come to appreciate better the greatness of our God and his plan for our salvation.

Advent comes from the Latin word *adventus* which is a translation of the Greek word *parousia* which means the coming. In this case, it is the coming of our God into human form in **history** at Christmas 2000+ years ago, but it is also the word in Greek that refers to the second coming of our God at the end of time in **majesty**. We prepare for the celebration of the coming of our God in history during the time of Advent; we prepare for the coming of our God at the end of time with our whole lives, since when Christ comes in glory we will be raised from the dead, be reunited with our resurrected bodies, go through the Last Judgment, and be rewarded for our preparation or lack of it with heaven or hell. This is the great story within which we live our lives, the story of God's love for us – a love which gives the deepest meaning to our lives for eternity.

When we plant crops or a garden, we till the ground and fertilize it, cultivate it and prepare it to produce a good crop or fruitful plants. By analogy, we are the soil into which the mystery of the incarnation is introduced. If we are to bear fruit, produce a rich harvest, we need to prepare to become the new creation which will grow in and around us. But growth means change, and change can make us uncomfortable.

One of the things we are going to do to point out this need to prepare for Christmas is to prepare the manger in our sanctuary for the coming of the Christ-child. We have a manger with some straw nearby in the sanctuary. We are asking parishioners to prepare the manger by putting straw in it, ONE STRAW AT A TIME. Especially the children will be encouraged to put a straw into the manger whenever they do a good deed – e.g. come to Mass, go to confession, do an act of kindness for someone else out of love. On the other hand, when we do something sinful, we will want to remove a straw from the crib. Over the three weeks of Advent, we hope to prepare a manger with straw to receive the Christ-child at Christmas. At the same time, by doing works of love, by removing the obstacles preventing us from receiving Christ whole-heartedly into our lives at Christmas, we hope to prepare OURSELVES to be a worthy dwelling place for Christ. The manger is a SIGN of our own preparation. Let's see how this works out; let us make the effort this Advent, brief as it is, to truly prepare for the coming of our God at Christmas.

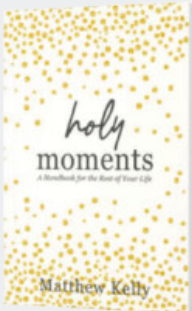
