MISSION STATEMENT

"We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve."

When I go to the Internet to see what the Chiefs did, the news media invariably gives the highlights of the game. This means the important plays, the outstanding plays, the key plays which determined the winner and the loser. This is what the first reading does during Lent – gives a highlight of a key event of salvation history in the Old Testament. Now this is different from Ordinary time, where the first reading gives a context or a point of reference from which to view the gospel – the two readings compliment and explain one another, the first (OT) reading setting the stage and being fulfilled in the gospel reading; the gospel reading receiving its context from the OT reading and sometimes showing how the OT reading is fulfilled. So Lent is organized differently. The aim of the first readings is to present key events in the history of salvation and thus acquaint the catechumens with the high points of the time before Jesus over the course of Lent.

Let us look at the readings for this Lent:

Week 1: Genesis 9:8 – 15, the covenant between God and Noah. Because of the sinfulness of humanity, God tries to “start over” with the animals and the eight people in the Ark. He makes a covenant with them, promising not to destroy all flesh with flood waters again. Iniquity of humanity has brought calamity on humanity, and we start over in hope.

Week 2: Genesis 22:1-2, 9, 10-13, 15-18, The Abraham's willingness to sacrifice his only son, Isaac, at God's command. This sacrifice foresees the sacrifice of God's only son, Jesus, for the sake of redeeming humanity. Abraham's faith issues in obedience: the willingness to do whatever God asks, no matter what. He and Isaac are a type which is fulfilled in God the Father allowing Jesus to be crucified. It is no coincidence that the mount on which Isaac was almost sacrificed is the same as the mount on which Jesus was crucified.

Week 3: Exodus: 1-17, the giving of the Ten Commandments on Mt. Sinai. This is the covenant which most people remember from the Old Testament, the one which defined the Jews as God's Chosen People. The tablets with the Ten Commandments on them were the most precious item that Israel possessed.

Week 4: 2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23 This is a summary of the disobedience of Israel in spite of the sending of prophets to warn them; it recounts the doom and destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple with the ensuing exile in Babylon, and then the return of the Jews to Jerusalem at the behest of Cyrus, the Persian king. The tablets of the Ten Commandments were lost and the house of David was conquered. This event crushed the hope of so many Jews.

Week 5: Jeremiah 31:31-34 Speaking through Jeremiah the prophet, God promises to make yet another new covenant with His people. He promises to forgive their many iniquities, and this time to write His law upon their hearts. On this Sunday the prophesy ends in hope, after all the discouragement and tumult of the past. This is the final Sunday before Palm Sunday.

Week 6: Isaiah 50:4-7 This is one of four “suffering servant” passages read during Holy Week. It looks to the passion and death of Jesus, which is the gospel on this day. In that sense, this first reading prophesies the passion of Jesus in which it is fulfilled. The passion from Mark is read today, and so this fits the pattern of the Ordinary Time first readings, as the first reading points us forward towards Christ's passion and Good Friday of this week.

So those are the “highlights” of salvation history recounted in the first readings during Lent cycle “B”.

May God bless all of you during this Lenten season.
