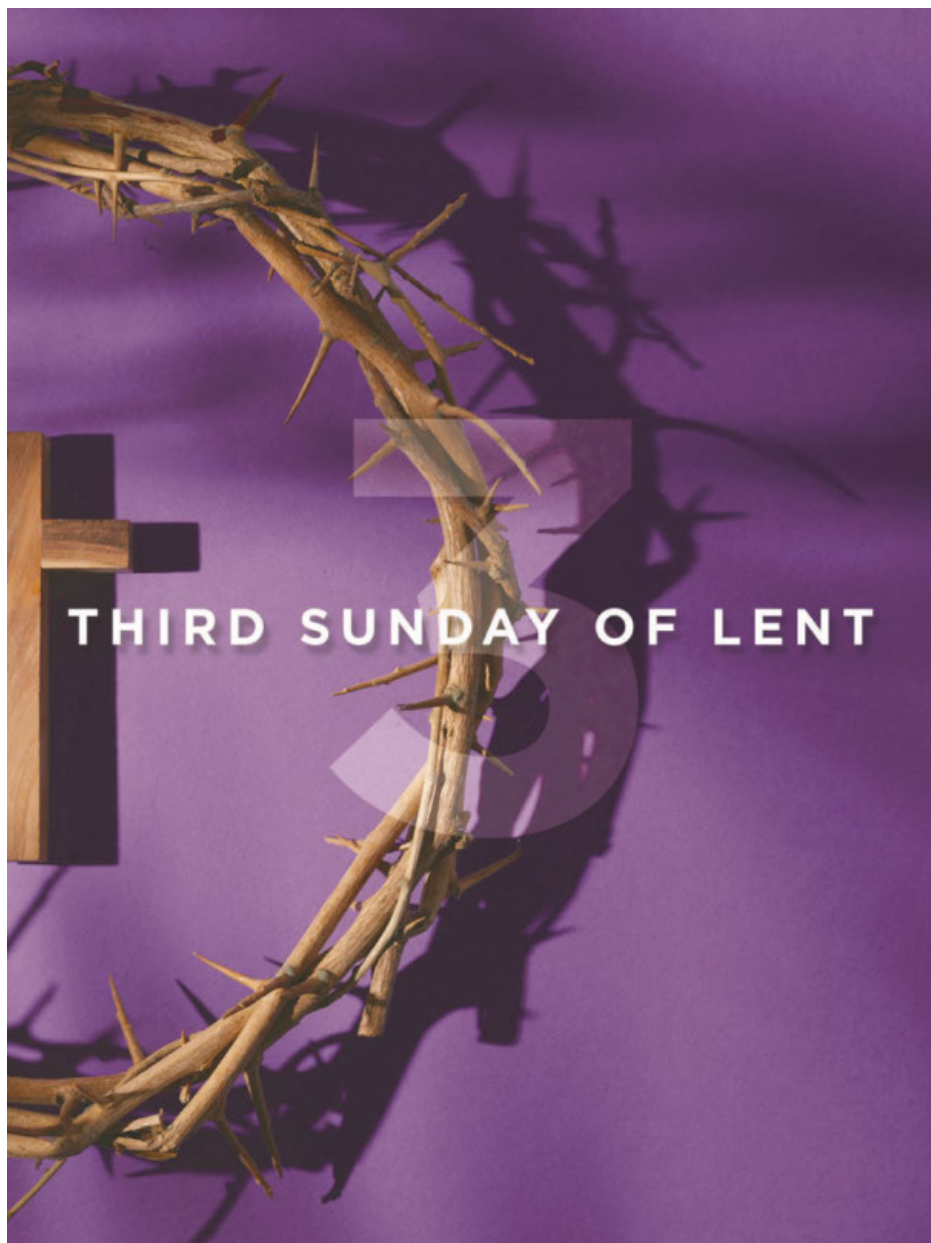

MISSION STATEMENT

"We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve."

We are in the process of creating a Master Plan, and it is moving along nicely. Why are we doing this? Let me give you a brief history. The need for more space for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd has become acute for two reasons: 1) we have given them all the space we can spare, and 2) some who have forfeited their space want it back now.

When I came here in the summer of 2017, we started teaching our children according to a new method called the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS). We trained our first catechist (teacher) that summer and she offered CGS to three-year-old children in the religious education program and in the pre-school. Each year we have added a year to the program: 3-year olds, then 3- & 4-year-olds, then 3-, 4-, & 5-year-olds, up to 8-year-olds last year. This year the original class is in 4th grade, and for the first time we were not able to continue their training though there are 3 more years of the program. They and we were disappointed because they enjoy the classes. Why were we unable to continue?

1) We did not have anyone trained to teach them yet at their level (we will next year).

2) We do not have the space to create another atrium. CGS has taken over the basement of the old rectory, the old band room in the school, and the meeting room in the parish office area. We have no other space available. I wanted to move slowly on this and see if CGS would have sustained interest and growth. It has shown both, as you saw from the video we showed recently on Sunday. We have had a number of people come forward to be trained to teach, and they are teaching well. We need to discuss the need for more space for CGS – it is a leap forward in our ability to communicate God's love and His plan of salvation to our children.

While we were discussing the need for more space for CGS, other needs/wants came to the fore: we had already discussed new playgrounds, there is no space for a nurse's station that is separate and provides confidentiality, a place for Eucharistic Adoration, need for more refrigerator/freezer space in our cafeteria, a place for tutoring (they are using parish office space, open as it is), and multiple groups like A & E need/want more storage space. In addition, it has been suggested that we could use a canopy or car port to allow covered access to church from the parking lot in inclement weather.

With all these suggested improvements, we need a Master Plan to prioritize and decide what we can afford to do now. But before we finalize the Master Plan, we need input from everyone who sees needs. Please think about your experience of worship, the physical plant, the worship aids, the things we have and don't have in the parish and what would make this place a more welcoming, positive, joyful place to worship the Lord. I want to hear from all who have an idea or concern that would improve our place.

To that end, we are going to offer you a survey to fill out. It will be sent out on flocknote for those who like to give electronic feedback, but also will be available to those who come to Mass or to the Office to fill out manually. Many have already come forward through the school or the Pastoral Council with suggestions. But if we are going to do a Master Plan, I want all those who worship here to have a chance to have their say, to put forth an idea or a concern.

In inviting everyone, I cannot promise that all wishes will be fulfilled, at least not right away. Already, we may have more things to do than we can afford, but there might be an idea or observation among those who have not come forward which, when we see it, we will say, "Why didn't I think of that?" At any rate, I want this to be an effort on the part of ALL of us, so I want ideas and suggestions from ALL who have anything they want to offer or suggest.
