

MISSION STATEMENT

"We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve."

In the first week of January, I attended the SEEK conference in St. Louis put on by FOCUS. At the conference I heard Msgr. James Shea speak on one of my favorite topics: that the Church is a hospital for sinners, not a country club for the righteous. He had some interesting things to say.

God is waging a battle against the forces of darkness. In one sense, the battle has been won by Christ's suffering, death, resurrection, ascension, and sending of the Holy Spirit. On the other hand, it is not yet won for each age in which we live – we must carry our crosses, fight the good fight, and win the battle for our times. The Church is where the battles are fought. The battle is fought on three fronts: 1) The World, 2) within the Church against those who betray, divide, or misinterpret the will of God and His message, and 3) within hearts and minds of each one of us in the Church.

- 1) The battle against the World is fought to claim our culture, to establish a moral compass which recognizes the dignity and value of human life. This was exemplified by the many struggles of the Church against pagan culture in the time of the Roman Empire, and continues today to Christianize the cultures of nations all over the world. Some of the enemies are materialistic ways of organizing nations (Communism, Capitalism, e.g.). This is the fight to convince and bring our neighbors into our Church and convert them to the vision of life and history that we call Salvation History with Christ at the center.
- 2) The battle fought within the Church is over the darkness which influences all of us on account of original sin. We should not be surprised if the maladies of the day find their way into the Church (pedophile priests, greedy bishops or pastors, men seeking power to rule over others through Church positions rather than to serve others would be some examples). Jesus criticized the leaders of His day for their pride and manipulation of the law. Those who teach heresy, who divide the Church, rather than unite it, are servants of darkness, not light. The existence of so many thousands of Christian sects is evidence of this battle. For the most part, correcting these issues is left to those in power who have the means to do the job, not to the average disciples. Jesus himself said to obey the Scribes, Pharisees, and Chief Priests, but do not imitate them. He did not say to attack them, and above all wanted to keep us united. Fighting this battle is left for Jesus, His apostles, and their successors to do. So it is left for those in power to take care of.
- 3) The battle fought within each of us is between darkness and light as it exists within each of our hearts and minds. This is the most important arena of the battle between darkness and light. If this is not won, then the battle cannot be won within the Church or the with the World. We have recently seen that the overturning of Roe vs. Wade in our country has not solved the problem of abortion. That is because the hearts and minds of those in our country have not been converted. Laws are most effective when they represent the convictions of the majority of the people. Each of us is required to fight this fight within our hearts and minds to make Christ our King, to welcome the New Creation which Jesus brought in by the Paschal Mystery. We can bring the Kingdom of God here to earth more effectively by acts of self-denial, charity, humility, service of others, and faith than by social or political action. The arrival of the Kingdom of God begins within each of us. This is the battle we fight for during Lent the fight for conversion and holiness brought about by our Lenten fasting, alms, and prayer. It is an attempt to discern God's will for us and establish in ourselves the will and the discipline to follow Christ WHEREVER He leads us. That kind of disciple persuades by self-sacrificial love, the love exemplified by Christ while he was on earth in serving, healing, and teaching others, and ultimately dying for us.

How are we doing this Lent?


