Santa Barbara (right side of church, when facing the altar, between Stations IX and X)

The Tenth Mission: Mission Santa Barbara, Santa Barbara, CA

Mission Santa Barbara was founded by Padre Fermín Lasuén on December 4, 1786, the feast day of Saint Barbara. The Mission grounds occupy a rise between the Pacific Ocean and the Santa Ynez Mountains, and were consecrated by Father Fermín Lasuén, who had taken over the presidency of the California mission chain upon the death of Saint Junipero Serra. The mission is the namesake of the city of Santa Barbara as well as of Santa Barbara County.

Mission Santa Barbara is the only mission to remain under the leadership of the Franciscan Friars since its founding, and today is a parish church of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

Mission Santa Barbara's name comes from the legend of Saint Barbara. The early missionaries built three different chapels during the first few years, each larger than the previous one. It was only after the Santa Barbara earthquake on December 21, 1812, which destroyed the existing buildings, that the construction on the current Mission was begun. In 1818, two Argentine ships under the command of the French privateer Hipólito Bouchard approached the coast and threatened the young town of Santa Barbara. The padres armed and trained 150 of the neophytes to prepare for attack. With their help, the Presidio soldiers confronted Bouchard, who sailed out of the harbor without attacking.

Accounts place Saint Barbara in the 3rd century in Heliopolis Phoenicia, present-day Lebanon. There is no reference to her in the authentic early Christian writings nor in the original recension of Saint Jerome's martyrology. Despite the legends detailing her story, the earliest references to her supposed 3rd century life do not appear until the 7th century, and veneration of her was common, especially in the East, from the 9th century.

Because of doubts about the historicity of her legend, she was removed from the General Roman Calendar in the 1969 revision, though not from the Catholic Church's list of saints.

Saint Barbara continues to be a popular saint in modern times, perhaps best known as the patron saint of armorers, artillerymen, military engineers, miners and others who work with explosives and also of mathematicians.

According to the hagiographies, Barbara, the daughter of a rich pagan named Dioscorus, was carefully guarded by her father who kept her locked up in a tower in order to preserve her from the outside world. Having secretly become a Christian, she rejected an offer of marriage that she received through her father.

Before going on a journey, her father commanded that a private bath-house be erected for her use near her dwelling, and during his absence, Barbara had three windows put in it, as a symbol of the Holy Trinity, instead of the two originally intended. When her father returned, she acknowledged herself to be a Christian; upon this he drew his sword to kill her, but her prayers created an opening in the tower wall and she was miraculously transported to a mountain gorge, where two shepherds watched their flocks. Dioscorus, in pursuit of his daughter, was rebuffed by the first shepherd, but the second betrayed her. For doing this, he was turned to stone and his flock was changed to locusts.

Dragged before the prefect of the province who had her cruelly tortured, Barbara held true to her Christian faith. During the night, the dark prison was bathed in light and new miracles occurred. Every morning, her wounds were healed. Torches that were to be used to burn her went out as soon as they came near her. Finally, she was condemned to death by beheading. Her father himself carried out the death-sentence. However, as punishment, he was struck by lightning on the way home and his body was consumed by flame.

In our window, St. Barbara is portrayed holding a tower with three windows, carrying a palm branch to symbolize the victory of the faithful over enemies of the soul and the sword used to behead her. The sword and tower also symbolize her as the patron saint of armorers and military engineers.

Resuming of Public Masses in Diocese of San Jose, Effective June 15, 2020

Guidelines and Requirements of Attendance at Mass

General Guidelines:

- ⇒ Dispensation for Sunday Obligation is still granted until further notice.
- ⇒ People who are in high-risk categories should refrain from attending public worship
 - Persons over the age of 65;
 - Persons with underlying health issues or compromised immune systems
- ⇒ Persons who have been exposed to COVID-19 should not attend Mass or other parish gatherings.
- ⇒ People who are ill or not feeling well, should refrain from attending public worship, parish activities, or coming to the church for private prayer and devotion, including
 - People with a cough or who are sneezing;
 - People who are not feeling well
- ⇒ Social distancing will be observed.
- ⇒ Wear face covering/mask at all times outside of your car and sanitize hands frequently.

For Mass in Physical Attendance:

- ◇ Attendance
 - ALL attending must be in good health condition.
 - Restrooms in the Church will not be open for use.
 - Please arrive 15-20 minutes before the scheduled Mass time for which you have a Confirmed Reservation per Parish process.
 - Limited seating capacity (currently is 100 people inside and 200 people in outdoor area, including priest and lector)
 - A reservation is required to attend any Mass in order to keep attendance to the limits placed by the County Orders restrictions.
 - Call the parish office OR reserve online thru Parish website
 - One reservation is needed for each attendee. All members of the same household attending the Mass must each have a reservation to keep to the limits.
 - Those living in the same household are to stay and be seated together.
 - Wearing of masks is required by everyone over the age of 6 years of age.
 - For outdoor Mass, we request that you bring your own portable chair if possible in order to reduce the amount of disinfecting that will need to be done after Mass.
 - Sanitize your hands before entering and exiting the Mass area. We request that you bring hand sanitizer with you.
- ◇ Communion
 - Receive Holy Communion reverently only by hands for the safety of all.
 - Observe social distancing while in line for Communion (please follow directions which are given by Priest or Usher)
 - Sanitize before receiving Communion (sanitizers at communion stations)
 - Return to your seat and stay until the final blessing and dismissal
- ◇ Dismissal
 - Sanitize hands before exiting
 - Follow the instructions given on how everyone will exit while keeping 6ft apart.
 - We will start leaving bulletin on tables for pick up. Our ushers will not be handing them out.
 - We ask all those who did not bring their own chair and used a Church chair to wipe down the chair you occupied with disinfectant wipes.
 - Dispose wipes in the bin provided

***Upon reaching your respective houses, please do not forget to wash your hands before doing anything.

- ◆ You do not need a Facebook account to watch the live video
 - ◇ For those who must shelter at home:
 - You may designate a family member who will be attending Mass in-person to bring Holy Communion for you using a pyx and following proper protocol of transporting the Blessed Sacrament.



Palabra que da la Vida

CUALIDADES Y RESPONSABILIDADES



“Un hombre que se iba al extranjero llamó a sus empleados y los dejó encargados de sus bienes: a uno le dejó cinco talentos de plata, a otro dos, a otro uno; a cada cual según su capacidad. Luego se marchó...”. (Mt 25, 14-15)

La larga y hermosa parábola que narra el Evangelio de este domingo nos invita a pensar en el reparto de talentos que el Señor ha hecho y, en particular, en los que nos han tocado a nosotros. Quizá nos parezca que a otros les ha dado más, o que les ha dado algunos de los que a nosotros nos hubiera gustado tener. Nos sorprenderíamos si supiéramos que quizá esas personas tan envidiadas nos envidian a su vez a nosotros o envidian a otros cuyos talentos no poseen.

De lo que se trata no es de andar comparando quién tiene más y quién tiene menos, sino de ver lo que cada uno de nosotros ha recibido y sacarle el mejor partido posible para obtener el rendimiento que Dios espera. El Señor ha invertido en nosotros y tiene derecho a recibir los «intereses». Su inversión ha tenido muchas facetas: una familia religiosa en la que hemos recibido la fe y un alto concepto de la moral y del deber; unas determinadas posibilidades culturales; el nacimiento en un país y no en otro; la salud; los amigos; el encuentro con determinada persona o determinado grupo que te ha ayudado tanto en la vida, y así tantas y tantas cosas. Todos son dones de Dios, que nos han sido dados no por capricho o para que nos beneficiemos de ellos sólo nosotros, sino para que produzcan frutos de los que todos puedan enriquecerse. Dios tiene derecho a recoger en proporción a lo sembrado, en proporción a la invertido. Y si no lo hace, no olvidemos lo que también enseña la parábola: al que no ha querido rendir, el Señor le pedirá cuentas.

Propósito: Examinaré los dones que he recibido, para darle gracias a Dios y para rendir por ellos. ¿Qué ocurriría si, por no dar frutos, me los quitaran?


