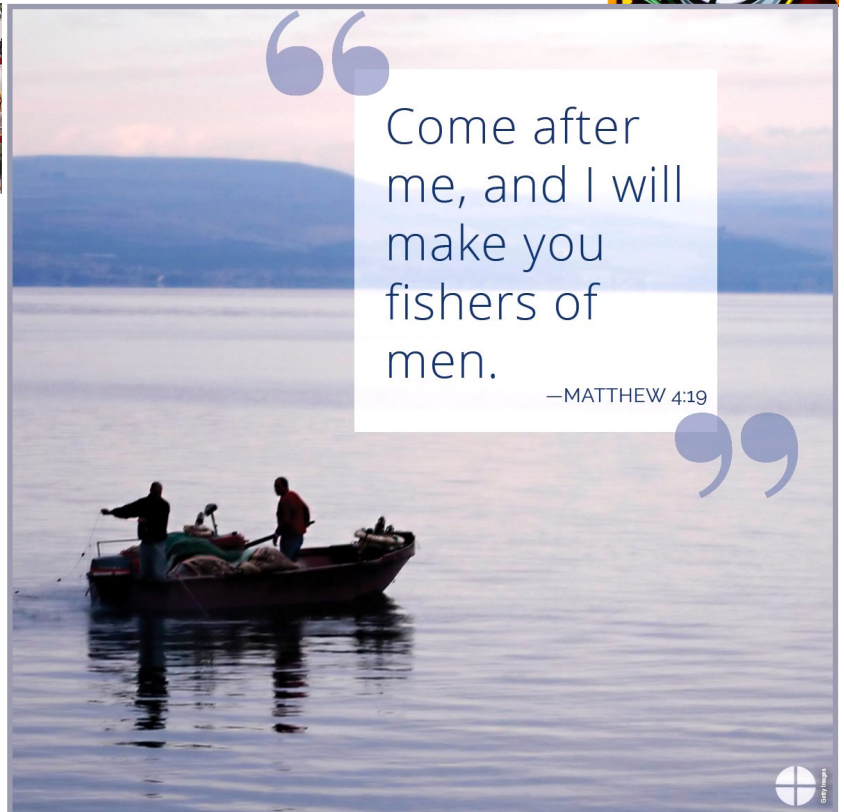

Liturgy Corner

The Call by Deborah Ferry

(taken from commentary on this week's readings)

The German theologian and philosopher Rudolph Otto characterized people's experience of the holy as a *mysterium tremendum et fascinans* – a terrifying and fascinating mystery, wholly other, yet compassionate and gracious. In each of today's readings we find manifestations of the holy to be terrifying and yet attractive. This results from the human person's awareness of smallness and unworthiness in the presence of God's overwhelming majesty. Yet none of today's readings dwells on the vision of awe-inspiring holiness but on the call that lies at the heart of that vision.

Isaiah experiences the call to his prophetic office within the great temple, God's earthly dwelling, where God, who is "wholly other," sits like a mighty warrior Lord on a "high and lofty throne." All of his images speak of grandeur and might: This is a meeting of the human and divine, and while God remains "wholly other," Isaiah's dialogue with the angel and the Lord reveals a God who is also merciful and attractive (*fascinans*).

In St. Paul's first Letter to the Corinthians, he reviews the essentials of the faith and reasserts the indispensability of faith. We also note that St. Paul makes reference to his own fearful and fascinating encounter with the divine when the risen Christ appeared to him on the road to Damascus. It was there he experienced the call to conversion that he later passed on to the Corinthians.

In this week's Gospel, Jesus is accepted by Peter, James, and John, who abandon all in favor of him. Like today's Isaiah reading, this is a *call* text. But instead of a heavenly vision of divine glory, Peter's call occurs amid the smelly nets and sweaty palms of earthly life. The very human context of this story provides contrast with Isaiah but, more importantly, makes a statement about God's presence in the world of human affairs. When God calls, it is in the midst of daily life. When our hands are dirty and smelly, Jesus comes and asks us to drop everything and follow him.

Palabra Que Da La Vida

"Al ver esto, Simón Pedro se arrojó a los pies de Jesús, diciendo: 'Apártate de mí, Señor, que soy un pecador'.... Jesús dijo a Simón: 'No temas: desde ahora serás pescador de hombres.'" (Lc 5, 8-11)

Ante el milagro, ante la irrupción de Dios en la propia vida, siempre hay dos posturas: la de echar a correr despavorido, porque se intuye que tras conocer a Dios hay que cambiar de vida, y la de postrarse a los pies del Señor pidiendo ayuda para poder hacer lo que la conciencia te está diciéndote que tienes que hacer. El primero, el que huye, en el fondo sabe que es un pecador, pero no quiere que se lo digan y ni siquiera desea decírselo él mismo. El segundo también lo sabe, pero ha decidido quedarse para, con la fuerza de Dios, darle al Señor lo que Él tiene derecho a encontrar.

Sin embargo, con frecuencia, tras la conversión, el que ha optado por quedarse junto a Cristo experimenta la rutina. Una rutina que consiste en ver cómo los pecados se repiten. Parece entonces que la conversión ha sido falsa o que los pecados están tan arraigados en la propia naturaleza que es inútil cualquier esfuerzo por suprimirlos. Esta experiencia del propio pecado reiterado conduce a muchos al desánimo y, como consecuencia, al abandono de la lucha y al alejamiento.

Quizá habría que ser más humilde para poder perseverar. La humildad de aquellos que, al comprobar que no pueden construirle a Dios la catedral que merece, deciden ofrecerle al menos un pajar. No podrán dar el cien por cien, por mucho que lo intenten, pero están decididos a darle todo lo que puedan, aunque sea poco. Sólo los humildes perseveran. Sólo los que aceptan las derrotas vencen. Sólo los que siguen confesándose, aunque no experimenten grandes cambios, terminan por alcanzar la santidad.

Propósito: Confesarse, aunque se sepa que se va a volver a caer. Volver a empezar en la relación con el prójimo, pidiendo perdón o perdonando, mientras haya una posibilidad de solución.

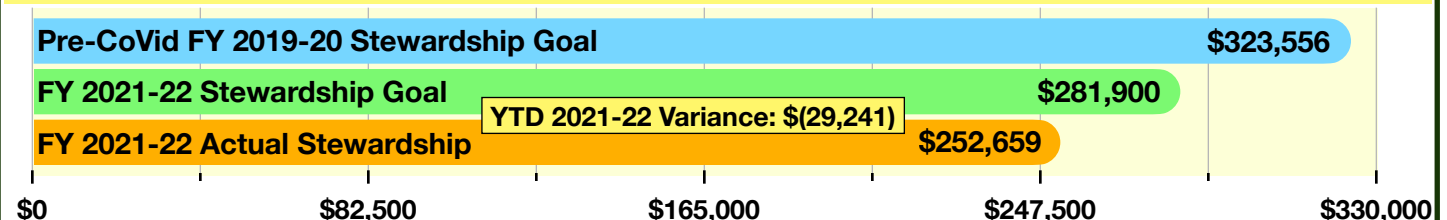

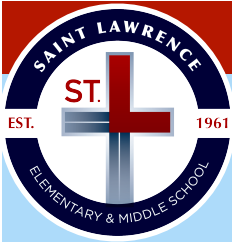
