From the Desk of Fr. Mark

Happy 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time! What a joy and blessing the month of February has been.

Just a few short notes for this week's bulletin:

1. Thank you for everyone who has already contributed to the **Annual Diocesan Appeal (ADA)**. We are off to a very good start...and you will see a message like this every week until we are done...I would ask that you prayerfully consider a pledge/donation to the ADA...every dollar above the goal that we receive is returned to the parish for the purpose of the upkeep of our church building.
2. St. Lawrence the Martyr is hosting a priest from Nigeria who is studying at Santa Clara University. **Fr. Ukeme-Abasi Joseph Bassey**, will be with us for some time. You will begin seeing him celebrating Masses at St. Lawrence and other liturgical activities as we welcome him into our community. Fr. Ukeme is studying counseling while at Santa Clara University.
3. Lent is just around the corner. **Ash Wednesday is on March 2nd**. We will be publishing the schedule of Lenten services and events in the coming week. It is important we begin our preparations for this season, not just on Fat Tuesday/Mardi Gras (March 1) but to begin planning for our time of fasting, prayer and alms giving that mark our Lenten journey.
4. **Our parish school at St. Lawrence is accepting new students**. It is my personal invitation to all families to consider Catholic education. I would also ask you to help us to invite those young families living in our neighborhoods to come and see the blessings of Catholic schools and Catholic education.
5. **Lastly, on the first Sunday of Lent, March 6, Bishop Oscar Cantú will be lifting the dispensation on the obligation for attending Mass in the Diocese of San Jose. It will continue to be the practice of the Church that if you have a "serious reason" or "grave cause" you are excused from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday or a Holy Day of Obligation. We are reminded of who we are when we gather as community. You can find a link to the full letter from our Bishop on the parish website and on the parish Facebook page. For you who are already attending Mass it is the time to once more invite and encourage all our family and friends to re-engage in the life of the Church and in the practice of the faith by coming to the table of the Lord.**

1. Gracias a todos los que ya han contribuido a la **Campaña Diocesana Anual (ADA)**. Hemos tenido un muy buen comienzo... por lo que verá un mensaje como este cada semana hasta que terminemos... Quiero pedirle por favor que en oración considere una promesa/donación a la ADA... cada dólar por encima de la meta que recibimos se devuelve a la parroquia con el propósito de mantener el edificio de nuestra iglesia.
2. La Comunidad de San Lorenzo Mártir recibe a un sacerdote de Nigeria que está estudiando Consejería en la Universidad de Santa Clara, **el Padre Ukeme-Abasi Joseph Bassey**, quien estará con nosotros por un tiempo, por lo que empezará a verlo celebrar Misas en St. Lawrence y otras actividades litúrgicas, por lo que le damos la bienvenida a nuestra comunidad.
3. La Cuaresma está a la vuelta de la esquina. **El miércoles de ceniza es el 2 de marzo**. Publicaremos el calendario de servicios y eventos de Cuaresma en la próxima semana. Es importante que empecemos nuestra preparación para este tiempo, no solo el Mardi Gras (1 de marzo), sino que comencemos a planificar nuestro tiempo de ayuno, oración y limosna que marca nuestra jornada de Cuaresma.
4. **Nuestra escuela parroquial de St. Lawrence está aceptando nuevos estudiantes**. Es mi invitación personal a todas las familias el considerar la educación católica. También les pediría que nos ayuden a invitar a las familias jóvenes que viven en nuestros vecindarios a que vengan y vean las bendiciones de las escuelas y la educación católica.
5. **Por último, el primer domingo de Cuaresma, 6 de marzo terminará la dispensa que Monseñor Oscar Cantú concedió con respecto a la obligación de asistir a Misa en la Diócesis de San José, por lo que continuará siendo la práctica de la Iglesia que solo cuando se tenga una "razón seria" o "causa grave" se estará exento de la obligación de asistir a Misa el domingo o un día de Precepto. Ya que cuando nos reunimos como comunidad se nos recuerda quienes somos. Puede encontrar un enlace a la carta completa de nuestro Obispo en el sitio web y la página de Facebook de la parroquia. Palabra Que Da La Vida



“Dichosos los pobres porque vuestro es el reino de Dios. Dichosos los que ahora tenéis hambre, porque quedaréis saciados. Dichosos los que lloráis, porque reiréis. Dichosos vosotros cuando os odien

los hombres y os excluyan y os insulten a causa del hijo del hombre.” (Lc 6, 20-23)

Cristo sorprendió a sus contemporáneos con aquel sermón conocido como el de la montaña, en el que proclamó las bienaventuranzas. Ese mensaje sigue siendo hoy igual de sorprendente y, aparentemente, contradictorio. ¿Cómo voy a considerarme dichoso si paso hambre, si lloro o si soy perseguido? Lógicamente, no se trata de una invitación al masoquismo, como si la felicidad estuviera ligada a las desgracias. Se trata de una visión diferente de la vida y de los valores a los que damos importancia. Las bienaventuranzas se entienden desde el amor, porque son manifestaciones del amor.

Serían algo semejante a esto: “Dichoso tú que has dado limosna para que otros tuvieran algo de comer o con qué vestir. Dios te lo va a recompensar en el cielo y vas a encontrar una alegría y una paz inmensa en la tierra”. “Dichoso tú, que ahora estás aguantando las burlas de los que te rodean porque tienes principios morales y no quieres renunciar a ellos. Llegará un día en que te darás cuenta de que elegiste el camino correcto, mientras ves cómo lo pasan mal, víctimas de sus excesos, los que ahora se ríen de ti”. “Dichoso tú, si te critican por ser mi discípulo e incluso si por ese motivo pierdes algún buen negocio. No te quepa duda de que Dios te lo pagará con creces, tanto en el cielo como en la tierra”. En definitiva, lo que el Señor nos dice es esto: “Dichoso tú cuando amas, cuando compartes, cuando perdonas, cuando eres fiel a tu conciencia. Dichoso tú porque estás invirtiendo en alegría y en felicidad, tanto en la tierra como en el cielo. Y esta alegría no te la quitará nadie”.

Propósito: Analizar el propio comportamiento a la luz de cada una de las bienaventuranzas. ¿Doy limosna? ¿Acompaño al solitario y al que sufre? ¿Doy la cara por Cristo? ¿Trabajo por la paz?

Liturgy Corner

**Healthy Fruit for Eternal Life -
6th Sunday in Ordinary Time by Deborah Ferry
(taken from commentary on this week's readings)**

The Book of Jeremiah combines history, biography, and prophecy. It portrays a nation in crisis and introduces the reader to an extraordinary person whom the Lord called to prophesy under the trying circumstances of the final days of the kingdom of Judah. Jeremiah was born, perhaps about 650 B.C., of a priestly family from the village of Anathoth, two and a half miles northeast of Jerusalem.

Adopting the language of the wise, Jeremiah sketches opposite postures in life, the senseless, who trust in the things of the passing world, and the wise, who trust in the Lord. True security is placing oneself in God's hands. The prophet finds his contemporaries, beginning with the king, behaving like senseless people, relying on the fragile, passing things rather than on the Word of the Lord as the source of life. The contrasting images are poignant: the person who trusts in things of the passing world are “like a barren bush in the desert that enjoys no change of season.” The description reminds one of the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah: a lava waste, “a salt and empty earth.” On the other hand, the one who trusts in God “is like a tree planted beside the waters...it fears not the heat when it comes.” Even in a year of drought, it bears fruit.

In the Second Reading, Paul points to the center of our hope: the Resurrection of Christ, without which we are lost. We are the most pitiable of people if we place our trust in what has no saving value. Christ, by his Resurrection from the dead, is the first fruits of salvation. The rest of the harvest is to follow. But if we believe in Christ Jesus, whose Resurrection is the pledge of our hope, we are also healthy fruit for eternal life.

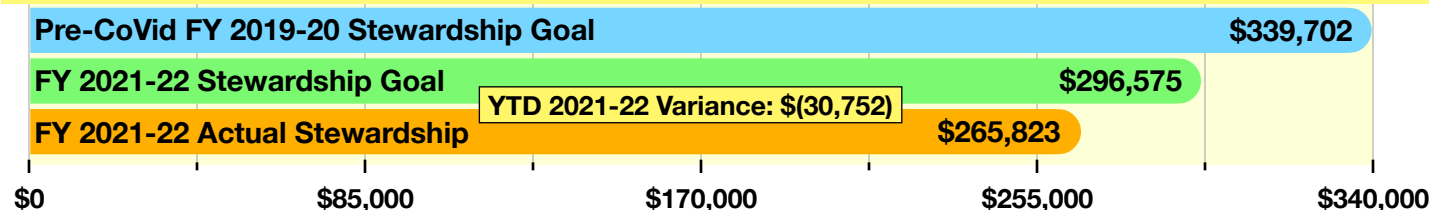

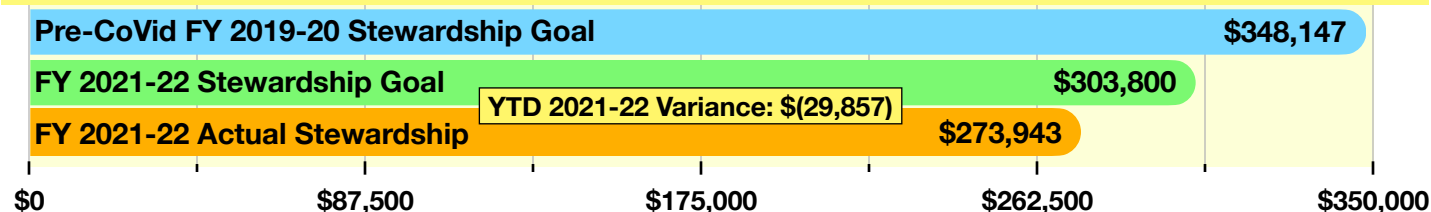
