From the Desk of Father Mark

Happy and Holy 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time! We continue to give thanks to God for the gift of rain and the blessing of the earth!

Just a quick reminder, next Sunday, January 29th we begin our Catholic Schools Week celebrations. St. Lawrence the Martyr has a long and wonderful history of supporting the local community in sharing the gift of Catholic education. I would like to invite the whole community to come and see the benefits and blessings of Catholic Schools and enjoy the breakfast/brunch the school is sponsoring in support of our Fifth Grade students' Science Camp week.

"I urge you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree in what you say, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and in the same purpose."
(1 Cor 1:10)

This is the opening sentence to our second reading this weekend. St. Paul places before us an almost impossible task of agreement and unity in purpose as a community. We all know that even within the family this is so very hard to do. So how are we called to be in "agreement" and live in "unity"? We are reminded, agreement doesn't mean sameness and unity doesn't mean we cannot differ on ideas but rather we are in agreement and unity on the singularity of purpose in bringing the presence of God into our lives and the life of the community.

We have been sharing for the past several months a "3 Minute Catechesis" on the Mass. The Mass can be a source of great contention but also of greater unity. Our hope in sharing these thoughts are to unite our worship and share our desire to be one with God.

United in worship we are then able, with God's grace, to **"Go into all the world and preach the Good News to everyone."** (Mk 16:15) In this, we see the interconnectedness of all the Church and all of creation where the proclamation of life and the dignity of each person is honored and celebrated.

Once more I invite each member of the parish to come to our School Open House... invite a friend and go out and proclaim the good news of Catholic schools.

Todos sabemos que incluso dentro de la familia esto es muy difícil de hacer. Entonces, ¿cómo estamos llamados a estar en "acuerdo" y vivir en "unidad". Se nos recuerda que el acuerdo no significa igualdad y la unidad no significa que no podamos diferir en ideas, sino que estamos de acuerdo y unidos en la singularidad del propósito de traer la presencia de Dios a nuestras vidas y a la vida de la comunidad.

Hemos estado compartiendo durante los últimos meses una "Catequesis de 3 Minutos" sobre la Misa. La Misa puede ser una fuente de gran contención, pero también de mayor unidad. Nuestra esperanza al compartir estos pensamientos es unir nuestra adoración y compartir nuestro deseo de ser uno con Dios.

Unidos en la adoración podemos entonces, con la gracia de Dios, **"Vayan por todo el mundo y prediquen la Buena Nueva a toda la creación"**. (Mc 16:15) En esto vemos la interconexión de toda la Iglesia y toda la creación donde se honra y celebra el anuncio de la vida y la dignidad de cada persona.

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Liturgy Corner

Isaiah 8:23-9:3 by Deborah Ferry
(taken from commentary on Today's First Reading)

The Book of Isaiah is the work of multiple authors, believed to have written three different sections of the book. They are referred to as First Isaiah (chapters 1 to 39), Second Isaiah (40 to 55), and Third Isaiah (56 to 66).

Today's First Reading comes from chapters 8 and 9; like all of chapters 1-11, these are considered to be the actual words of the prophet, First Isaiah. He wrote in the eighth century during the reign of King Ahaz, after the rise of Assyria. The first part of the reading speaks of the Lord's triumph over the lands that had been subject to Assyrian aggression and the light he brings to the territories in which Gentiles resided.

The three verses in the second half of today's reading are also proclaimed at the Christmas Mass at Midnight. The light imagery of the first section continues here. Originally a hymn for the prince of peace who will come after Ahaz, these verses describe the freedom from oppression the prince will bring to the people. The hope for this prince stands in contrast to Ahaz who failed at listening to Isaiah's demand for trust in God. Instead, Ahaz made his kingdom a vassal of Assyria and the people suffered.

Ultimately, Christians believe that Jesus Christ is the Prince of Peace, the one who overcomes oppression once, for all. His light shines in the darkness the way no other can.

Zebulun and Naphtali were two sons of Jacob. Their tribes settled in territories in Palestine that eventually were known by their names.

Zebulun and Naphtali were located north of Nazareth.

Naphtali was located immediately to the west of the Sea of Galilee. To the north was the village of Dan, to the west was Asher, to the south Zebulun, and to the east was the Jordan River.

Palabra Que Da La Vida

"Les dijo: 'Venid y seguidme y os haré pescadores de hombres'. Inmediatamente dejaron las redes y le siguieron". (Mt 4, 19)

El relato de la vocación de los primeros apóstoles nos invita a meditar sobre nuestra propia vocación, sobre la forma concreta en que debemos seguir al Señor. Unos están o estarán llamados al matrimonio. Otros a la consagración religiosa. Otros al sacerdocio. Todos a ser discípulos de Cristo y a intentar ser santos. Sin embargo, el planteamiento vocacional resulta inútil –incluso cuando teóricamente se produce– si no se está preparado para asumir las consecuencias que de ese planteamiento se deriven. De poco sirve preguntarle al Señor, como hizo San Francisco: "¿Qué quieres que haga?", si luego no se está en condiciones de llevar a la práctica lo que el Señor te pide. De hecho, con frecuencia, para no sentirse agobiado por lo que el Señor solicita de uno mismo, se termina por autoconvencerse de que eso no lo está pidiendo el Señor.

Ser fieles en lo poco es prepararse, entrenarse, para escuchar la voz de Dios, pida éste lo que pida. Y no sólo hay que verlo en el campo vocacional. También es importante en otros ámbitos; por ejemplo, en lo concerniente al dolor, a la enfermedad, al sufrimiento. Con frecuencia tus problemas te parecen gigantescos, hasta que surgen problemas mayores que los relativizan. Si no has aprendido a soportar pequeñas pruebas, sucumbirás ante las grandes.

Propósito: Entrenarse ante las dificultades, pensando que no son nada comparadas con otras. Preguntarle al Señor qué quiere que hagamos y hacer lo que Él nos pida.

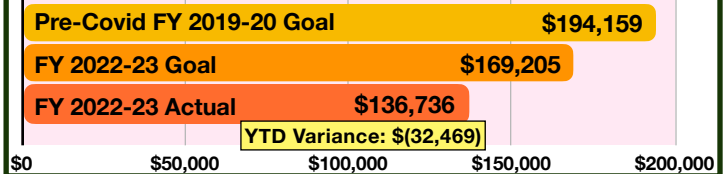

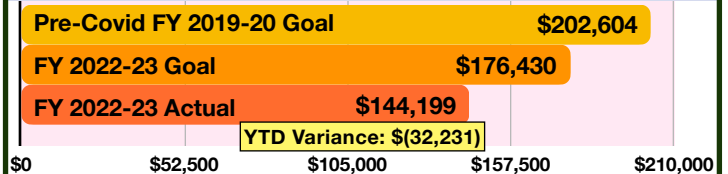
