

LITURGY CORNER

The Suffering Servant in Isaiah

(taken from commentary on the First Reading)

Relationships define us. Knowing to whom we matter gives us a sense of who we are. One can forego many things on a hard and perilous journey, but woe to the would-be explorer or missionary who lacks a clear sense of identity. Scholars debate the identity of the Suffering Servant (was he Israel, the prophet himself, the future Messiah?), but the Servant himself is clear about who he is; he is God's spokesperson, chosen from the womb to serve the Lord.


Thus far, God's service has been neither easy nor successful. The Servant has endured suffering and shame. But he has not yielded to discouragement for he understands the nature of his task and who it is asking him to undertake it. The world will define us if we let it; it will say that success matters most and that who we are depends on it. But the Servant knows better, "I am made glorious in the sight of the Lord," he announces. In other words, it's not my success that gives me strength, but "my God."

But now God offers a further and greater task that will be even more challenging than what the Servant has done before. It is not enough for you to bring my word to Israel, God tells him, "I will make you a light to the nations." That God's mercy and "salvation" would be offered to the entire world was a stunning truth for Israel, one she wasn't ready to hear. Despite hardship, however, the Servant will indeed bring that message to the nations and, eventually, they will embrace his word. The salvation of God continues to stretch to the "ends of the earth." It but needs our willingness to also embrace the task God gave the Suffering Servant.

St. Sebastian | January 20

Not much is known about the life of St. Sebastian (256 – 287), except that he was a Roman martyr whose name has been mentioned throughout history since early 350.

We see St. Sebastian many times in art, especially from iconic paintings from Guido Reni, Andrea Mantegna and Hendrick ter Brugghen. Historical scholars now agree that a spiritual story has the beloved saint entering the Roman army because only there could he assist Christian martyrs without arousing suspicion on himself. Eventually he was found out, brought before Emperor Diocletian and delivered to Mauritanian archers to be shot to death. Pierced with arrows, he was left for dead, but managed to survive. He recovered from his wounds but still refused to leave.

One day, St. Sebastian took up a position near where the emperor was to pass. He confronted the emperor, condemning him for his cruelty to Christians. This time the sentence of death was carried out, and St. Sebastian was beaten to death with clubs. Today he is the patron saint of athletes.



PALABRA QUE DA LA VIDA

"Este es el cordero de Dios, que quita el pecado del mundo" (Jn 1, 29)

Juan Bautista presenta a Jesús con un título y una misión que han servido después para identificar a Cristo a lo largo de los siglos. Le llama "cordero de Dios", con todas las alusiones que lleva consigo ese apelativo y que anuncian ya, mucho antes del Viernes Santo, cuál será el final del Maestro. Y dice de Él que ha venido "a quitar el pecado del mundo".

La definición de Juan no conviene olvidarla. No conviene perder de vista algo que lentamente tendemos a oscurecer: que Cristo es el salvador, el redentor, el libertador de la humanidad. Y que esa liberación se ha hecho mediante la lucha contra el pecado.

Hay un pecado que podríamos llamar estructural, social, que tiene terribles consecuencias sobre multitudes. Pocas veces podemos hacer algo contra este pecado, pues casi todos nosotros somos demasiado pequeños. Hay otro pecado que nos cae más a mano y es el nuestro; contra éste, sí podemos luchar. Y resulta que este pecado fastidia enormemente a los que nos rodean, haciéndoles con frecuencia la vida difícil e incluso imposible.

Dejemos a Jesús que quite el pecado del mundo –el estructural y el personal-. Colaboremos con él luchando contra ambos pecados, con todas nuestras fuerzas. Por el bien nuestro y el del prójimo.

Propósito: Colaborar para que desaparezcan las injusticias sociales y la violencia, al menos con la oración. Quitar nuestros pecados mediante la confesión.

MAKE A POSITIVE IMPACT BY SHOWING SOLIDARITY WITH THE CHURCH IN LATIN AMERICA

Since 1965, Catholics in the United States have built relationships of unity and love with Catholics in Central and South America and the islands of the Caribbean through their participation in the annual special collection for the Church in Latin America. On the weekend of January 25-26, 2025, many U.S. parishes will take up this collection in order to support ministries that bring Christ's mercy to prisoners, train catechists in remote rural areas, and build up pastoral programs that address the crucial needs of refugees and victims of natural disasters.

By supporting this collection, you can also help nurture vocations for seminarians and religious sisters like the Poor Clare nuns pictured above on this year's campaign poster. This community, based in the Dominican Republic, used funds received from this collection to cover food, clothing, and educational costs for 18 of its sisters.
