

A Message from Fr. Mark / Un Mensaje del Padre Mark



Happy and blessed 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time—today our Diocese of San Jose and the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates the beginning of Catholic School week. Today I will write a little more about Catholic education and in particular our parish school St. Lawrence Dual Language Catholic School.

As we implement the pastoral plan of the Diocese we are challenged to look at Catholic “parochial” schools in an integrated system, not just for the parish, but for the greater Catholic community. In the document, *The Holy Sees: Teaching on Catholic Schools*, we are reminded strongly about the communal aspects when they write, “Catholic educators recognized that the bishop’s pastoral leadership is pivotal. In supporting the establishment and ensuring the catholicity of the school in his pastoral care...His responsibility for Catholic schools, derive from the *minus docent*, the office of teaching he received at his ordination... First, the bishop must integrate schools into his dioceses pastoral program, and second, he must oversee the teaching within them.” (34)

As we understand this old, but new, understanding of the unity of a community of schools, in integrating the Dual Language model at St. Lawrence we have actively reached out to families in those parishes around us, especially those without a Catholic school, seeking families to be welcomed into the family of Catholic education.

One of the marks of Catholic education “is the emphasis on the school as a community... There are four areas; the teamwork among those involved; the cooperation between educators and the bishops; the interaction of students with teachers; and the schools physical environment” (28-29) The teamwork and cooperation while primarily within the school, will naturally spread out into the greater school community, with parental alumni as well as a spiritual home for those who graduate.

All of this requires prayer by both the larger community and the school itself. We hear once more, “(p)rayer should be a normal part of the school day, so that students learned to pray in times of sorrow and joy, of disappointment and celebration, difficulty and success. Such prayer teaches students that they belong to the communion of Saints, a community that knows no bound.” (40-41). Prayer should be the normal part of each Christians day and I would ask you to continue to pray for both our parish and school community.

I would invite you to come and see our Catholic school from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on January 25 2026. At the same time enjoy the STEAM projects in the Community Center, talk to our staff and families about their experiences at St. Lawrence the Martyr Dual Language Catholic School.

Feliz y bendecido III domingo del Tiempo Ordinario: hoy nuestra Diócesis de San José y la Iglesia Católica en los Estados Unidos celebran el comienzo de la Semana de las Escuelas Católicas. Por lo que escribiré un poco más sobre la educación católica y, en particular, sobre nuestra escuela parroquial: la Escuela Católica Bilingüe San Lorenzo.

Al implementar el plan pastoral de la Diócesis, se nos presenta el desafío de considerar las escuelas católicas parroquiales como parte de un sistema integrado, no solo para la parroquia, sino para la comunidad católica en general. En el documento titulado “La Santa Sede: La Enseñanza en las Escuelas Católicas”, se nos recuerda con énfasis la importancia de los aspectos comunitarios, al afirmar: “Los educadores católicos reconocen que el liderazgo pastoral del obispo es fundamental para apoyar el establecimiento y garantizar la catolicidad de la escuela en su cuidado pastoral [...] Su responsabilidad con las escuelas católicas deriva del *minus docent*, el oficio de enseñar que recibió en su ordenación[...] Primeramente, el obispo debe integrar las escuelas en el programa pastoral de su diócesis, y segundo, debe supervisar la enseñanza dentro de ellas” (34).

Al comprender esta visión, antigua pero renovada, de la unidad de una comunidad de escuelas, y al integrar el modelo bilingüe en San Lorenzo, nos hemos acercado activamente a las familias de las parroquias vecinas, especialmente a aquellas que no cuentan con una escuela católica, para darles la bienvenida a esta familia de educación católica.

Una de las características de la educación católica “es el énfasis en la escuela como comunidad... Hay cuatro áreas: el trabajo en equipo entre los involucrados; la cooperación entre los educadores y los obispos; la interacción de los estudiantes con los maestros; y el entorno físico de la escuela” (28-29). El trabajo en equipo y la cooperación, si bien se dan principalmente dentro de la escuela, se extienden naturalmente a la comunidad escolar en general, incluyendo a los padres de los exalumnos, y constituyen un hogar espiritual para quienes se gradúan.

Todo esto requiere la oración tanto de la comunidad en general como de la propia escuela. Escuchemos una vez más: “La oración debe ser parte normal del día escolar, para que los estudiantes aprendan a orar en momentos de tristeza y alegría, de decepción y celebración, de dificultad y éxito. Esta oración enseña a los estudiantes que ellos son miembros de la comunión de los santos, una comunidad que no conoce límites” (40-41). La oración debe ser parte normal del día de cada cristiano, y les pido que continúen orando por nuestra comunidad parroquial y escolar. Les invito a visitar nuestra escuela católica el 25 de enero de 2026, de 11:00 a. m. a 1:00 p. m. Podrán disfrutar de los proyectos “STEAM” en el Centro Comunitario y conversar con nuestro personal y las familias sobre sus experiencias en la Escuela Católica Bilingüe San Lorenzo Mártir.

Patience, Explained!

In treating others with a spirit of patience, said Pope Francis, we “look at them ... with God’s gaze, knowing how to distinguish their faces from their faults.”

“Rushing and impatience are enemies of spiritual life,” he continued. “God is love, and those who love do not tire, they are not irascible; they do not give ultimatums. God is patient, God knows how to wait.” Patience is sometimes referred to as being “annexed” to the moral virtue of fortitude. In practicing patience, we bear any kind of suffering for a greater good. St. Thomas Aquinas describes patience as a means to “safeguard the good of reason against sorrow, lest reason give way to sorrow” (Sum. II-II, 136, Art. 1).

The virtue of patience is a fruit of the Holy Spirit (Galatians 5:22), and as Christians who have received the Holy Spirit we are called to “be patient in tribulation” (Romans 12:12) and to “preach the message (of Christ) ... with great patience” (2 Timothy 4:2).



Liturgy Corner

The Book of Isaiah is the work of multiple authors, believed to have written three different sections of the book. They are referred to as First Isaiah (chapters 1 to 39), Second Isaiah (40 to 55), and Third Isaiah (56 to 66).

Today's First Reading comes from chapters 8 and 9; like all of chapters 1-11, these are considered to be the actual words of the prophet, First Isaiah. He wrote in the eighth century during the reign of King Ahaz, after the rise of Assyria. The first part of the reading speaks of the Lord's triumph over the lands that had been subject to Assyrian aggression and the light he brings to the territories in which Gentiles resided.

The three verses in the second half of today's reading are also proclaimed at the Christmas Mass at Midnight. The light imagery of the first section continues here. Originally a hymn for the prince of peace who will come after Ahaz, these verses describe the freedom from oppression the prince will bring to the people. The hope for this prince stands in contrast to Ahaz who failed at listening to Isaiah's demand for trust in God. Instead, Ahaz made his kingdom a vassal of Assyria and the people suffered.

Ultimately, Christians believe that Jesus Christ is the Prince of Peace, the one who overcomes oppression once, for all. His light shines in the darkness the way no other can.

Zebulun and Naphtali were located north of Nazareth.




Palabra que da La Vida

“Les dijo: ‘Venid y seguidme y os haré pescadores de hombres’. Inmediatamente dejaron las redes y le siguieron”. (Mt 4, 19)

El relato de la vocación de los primeros apóstoles nos invita a meditar sobre nuestra propia vocación, sobre la forma concreta en que debemos seguir al Señor. Unos están o estarán llamados al matrimonio. Otros a la consagración religiosa. Otros al sacerdocio. Todos a ser discípulos de Cristo y a intentar ser santos. Sin embargo, el planteamiento vocacional resulta inútil –incluso cuando teóricamente se produce– si no se está preparado para asumir las consecuencias que de ese planteamiento se deriven. De poco sirve preguntarle al Señor, como hizo San Francisco: “¿Qué quieres que haga?”, si luego no se está en condiciones de llevar a la práctica lo que el Señor te pide. De hecho, con frecuencia, para no sentirse agobiado por lo que el Señor solicita de uno mismo, se termina por autoconvencerse de que eso no lo está pidiendo el Señor.

Ser fieles en lo poco es prepararse, entrenarse, para escuchar la voz de Dios, pida éste lo que pida. Y no sólo hay que verlo en el campo vocacional. También es importante en otros ámbitos; por ejemplo, en lo concerniente al dolor, a la enfermedad, al sufrimiento. Con frecuencia tus problemas te parecen gigantescos, hasta que surgen problemas mayores que los relativizan. Si no has aprendido a soportar pequeñas pruebas, sucumbirás ante las grandes.

Propósito: Entrenarse ante las dificultades, pensando que no son nada comparadas con otras. Preguntarle al Señor qué quiere que hagamos y hacer lo que Él nos pida.
