St. Blaise Blessing of the Throat, Explained

Perhaps it's an example of divine providence that the feast of St. Blaise falls on Feb. 3 – right in the middle of cold and flu season! This fourth-century Armenian saint was a bishop and martyr and is venerated as the patron of those who suffer from illnesses of the throat.

On his feast day, Catholics traditionally receive a blessing of the throat. This blessing is administered by a priest, deacon or a lay minister who follows the rites and prayers designated for a layperson. During the blessing, the minister takes two candles that were blessed on the feast of the Presentation and makes a cross in front of the throat, saying “Through the intercession of Saint Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness.” A priest or deacon will then make the sign of the cross.





Liturgy Corner *by Deborah Ferry*

Zephaniah – Remnant in Your Midst (taken from commentary on the First Reading)

After three Sundays of hearing the words of Isaiah, today we hear from the prophet Zephaniah. This is one of only two times in the Lectionary cycle of readings and the only time in Year A that the words of this prophet are proclaimed.

Zephaniah prophesied during the reign of King Josiah in the seventh century. The protest against the worship of false gods, and the condemnation of the pro-Assyrian court ministers who served as regents during Josiah's minority, allow us to place the work in the first decade of the reign. Accordingly, the prophecy of Zephaniah comes rightly before that of Jeremiah, who was probably influenced by it in both language and ideas. The previous king, Manasseh, had not upheld the law, and so Zephaniah inherited and tried to overcome the faithlessness of the people. The age of Zephaniah was a time of religious degradation, when the old idolatries reappeared and men worshiped sun, moon, and stars. Rites completely alien to the pure monotheism taught by Moses flourished in Jerusalem. At the time, the oppression that the Kingdom of Judah faced from Assyria was waning, but another aggressive power, Babylon, was flexing its muscles.

The opening verse of today's reading is the final verse of an oracle about the salvation of Judah and Jerusalem. This verse appeals to the Israelites to remain faithful to the Lord before the day of his anger, the day of the Lord, comes. On this day, the Lord will win victory over the oppressors, but only those who have remained faithful to him – the remnant – will be spared. Those followers of the Lord of justice and humility will be known by their actions. They will be people of righteousness, honesty, humility, and peace.

Palabra que da la Vida



“Dichosos los que lloran porque ellos serán consolados.” (Mt 5, 5)

El relato de las bienaventuranzas es considerado como el proyecto moral del cristianismo. Aunque éste se resume en un único mandamiento, tal y como enseñó Cristo en la Última Cena, el mandamiento del amor se desglosa en un nuevo y original tipo de mandamiento. Ya no se trata de no hacer el mal, sino sobre todo de hacer el bien. Y para hacer el bien tenemos que ser generosos con nuestro dinero, lo cual nos hace un poco más pobres a la par que hace a los que ayudamos un poco menos pobres. Para hacer el bien tenemos que cumplir con nuestras obligaciones, aunque eso nos suponga derramar alguna lágrima. Para hacer el bien tenemos que defender la causa de la justicia y, como consecuencia, estar al lado de los que sufren las injusticias, aunque nos incluyan a nosotros entre los perseguidos. Para hacer el bien debemos trabajar por la paz, quitando hierro a las situaciones de violencia, aunque eso nos complique la vida y corramos el riesgo de que nos ataquen las dos partes en conflicto. Para hacer el bien tenemos que perdonar, incluso aunque no recibamos de la otra parte un trato semejante.

Hay que intentar practicar todas las bienaventuranzas, pero, al menos, convendría empezar por una – por la que sea más fácil para uno mismo– y especializarse en ella, sin que eso suponga olvidar las demás.
