



We give glory and praise to God on this 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time! May the peace and joy of our Lord Jesus Christ fill your heart and family with the love of God. St. Paul reminds us in today's second reading that our faith is founded on Jesus Christ through his death and resurrection, and we are called to proclaim it with courage and love.

Spiritual renewal is a vital part of our journey. As we begin the work of implementing the Pastoral Plan of the Diocese of San Jose, I would like to invite you to a parish meeting on Tuesday, February 24, 2026, at 6:30 p.m. in our parish hall. The purpose of the meeting is two-fold.

- a. To allow us to share the broader vision of the direction we will be moving in the coming years, and have your input in some of the actions that will occur as part of the spiritual renewal of our community
- b. The second is to seek participation both in the Parish Leadership Team going forward, and leaders and volunteers to help make these actions go forward in the future.

All the work and planning we do, as part of the pastoral plan, is, as St. Paul reminds us, to proclaim the person of Jesus Christ and help us and all people to be drawn into the loving embrace of God. As we begin this new year, this is an exciting and holy time to share our faith and move closer to Jesus Christ. Please come and join us on this exciting journey.

Lent begins in just 10 days, Ash Wednesday, 18 February. If you haven't already, we should begin thinking about how our Lenten journey will help us grow in faith, hope, and love in our Lord Jesus Christ.

It may be helpful to look back at some of the reflections we did during the Advent-Christmas times or the book we received, *Slowing Down to the Speed of Joy*, as helpful tools to continue the path where God is leading you in your call to discipleship. You may want to begin with one of the three disciplines: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and begin praying about where you hope to grow in this part of your spiritual life. Prayers like, "Jesus, how can I deepen my prayer life this Lent?" More to come.

On Feb. 11, the Catholic Church celebrates the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. In Lourdes, France, in 1858, 13-year-old Bernadette Soubirous was collecting pieces of wood as part of her daily chores when she noticed a startling wind and rustling sound. The noise came from a nearby grotto. When Bernadette looked toward it, she saw it filled with a golden light and a beautiful lady. It was at this grotto that the Blessed Mother appeared to Bernadette 18 times and where millions of Catholic pilgrims visit the healing waters at the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Lourdes. Records have been kept from the exchanges between Bernadette and our Blessed Mother. Here are five of the most fascinating facts about the apparitions that took place at the grotto:

1. Paralysis

When Bernadette first saw the beautiful lady in the grotto during the first apparition, on Feb. 11, 1858, it is said that she immediately smiled at Bernadette and signaled to her to come closer, in the same way a mother motions to her child. Bernadette took out her rosary and knelt before the Lady, who also had a rosary on her right arm. When Bernadette tried to begin saying the rosary by making the sign of the cross, her arm was paralyzed. It was only after the Lady made the sign of the cross herself that Bernadette was able to do the same. The Lady remained silent as Bernadette prayed the rosary, but the beads of her rosary passed between her fingers.

2. The secret prayer

During the fifth apparition, which took place on Feb. 20, 1858, the Lady taught Bernadette a prayer, which she recited every day for the rest of her life. She never revealed the prayer to anyone, but she did say she was told to always bring a blessed candle with her. This is why candles perpetually burn at the Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes.

3. The Lady shares her name

At the 16th apparition, on March 25, 1858, the feast of the Annunciation, the Lady revealed her identity to Bernadette, calling herself the “Immaculate Conception.”

4. The burn of fire


Bernadette never forgot to bring a lighted candle to the grotto since she was told to do so by the Lady. During the 17th apparition, on April 7, 1858, Bernadette unconsciously placed one of her hands over the burning flame. Witnesses saw the flame burning through her fingers, and yet she was able to pray for 15 minutes with the flame burning her hand. As she emerged from her prayer, she was unscathed and didn't even notice cries of horror from the people in the crowd. Dr. Pierre Romaine Dozous, a well-known physician from Lourdes, took another lit candle and, without warning, placed the flame to her hand. Bernadette immediately cried out in pain.

5. The miracle of Bernadette's body

After the apparitions ended, Bernadette went on to become a Sister of Charity. She died at age 34 on April 16, 1879. She was buried on the convent grounds in Nevers, France. Thirty years later, on Sept. 22, 1909, her body was exhumed and found completely intact. A second exhumation took place on April 3, 1919. The body was found in the exact same state as it had been 10 years earlier. Bernadette was canonized a saint on Dec. 8, 1933, by Pope Pius XI.

Liturgy Corner

The Stumbling Block of Christianity

While Paul was in Ephesus on his third journey (1 Cor 16:8; Acts 19:1–20), he received disquieting news about Corinth. The community there was displaying open factionalism, as certain members were identifying themselves exclusively with individual Christian leaders and interpreting Christian teaching as a superior wisdom for the initiated few (1 Cor 1:10–4:21).

A weaker man might have sought a stronger argument; but no one has ever accused Paul of being weak (except himself, as we shall see). So he takes up the great stumbling block regarding Christianity and makes it the foundation of his argument: yes, the Son of God was crucified, the Messiah came in weakness and vulnerability and endured the ignominy of the Cross. That is Paul’s teaching delivered in simple, unadorned language that lacks the sophistication of eloquent oratory, but never lacks the power of truth, or the Spirit and the power of God.

Whether Paul had tried and failed or whether he knew his oratorical skills were eclipsed by evangelists like Apollos we cannot say with certainty. What we know for sure is that Paul chooses to imitate in his own demeanor the “weakness” of his crucified Lord. But Paul’s language is metaphorical, for in his life he faced beatings, imprisonment, and even death with great valor. What he means is that his life and teaching are imbued with the virtue we call “fear of the Lord,” a healthy and respectful fear that flows from awareness of God’s awesome majesty. Though some contemporary spirituality looks askance at notions of reverential fear, Paul endorses it as a chief means of working our salvation.

Paul’s self-effacement regarding his lack of “persuasive words of wisdom” is his way of teaching that human wisdom cannot save us; but the power of the Cross cannot fail.


