



LITURGY CORNER

Spiritually Mature

Just last week, Paul was downgrading human wisdom and denying having any of his own. Now he asserts that wisdom may in fact have an appropriate role in the life of the Christian. The wisdom of which he speaks, however, is of a radically different nature than what the world is used to and very different from the Gnostic brand to which members of the Corinthian community subscribed.

The wisdom to which Paul refers is the only one deserving of the name, and it is reserved to the "spiritually mature." Paul appropriates a word often used in the Gnostic sects; for them, "maturity" was a special privilege that came automatically, bestowed on them from above at Baptism. Part of the attraction of Gnosticism was its claim that special knowledge or wisdom was conferred on its members – wisdom others were denied.

But Paul intends a different kind of wisdom – the Cross of Jesus, for which the Gnostics had little use. The great hidden mystery about which Paul is truly excited is the one the Gnostics fail to see: the crucified one is the Lord of heaven and earth. Paul is not creating spiritual castes, but asserting that some are spiritual children while others have grown into spiritual adults. Christian adulthood requires being able to understand the supreme and lasting significance of the Cross. To relegate the Cross to the scrap heaps of history and focus only on the Resurrection is to miss the core of the Christian faith. And that is precisely what some of the Corinthians were doing.

Paul concludes rejoicing that what the human eye has not seen, what the human ear has not heard, and what has not yet entered the human heart, are nonetheless revealed to us "through the Spirit." Through that Spirit we gain access even to the "depths of God."

Gentleness, Explained!



As followers of Christ, we are commanded to "always be prepared to offer an explanation ... to justify the hope that is in you."

But the success of that evangelism hinges entirely on the very next instructions this passage contains: "However, do so with gentleness and respect" (1 Peter 3:15).

The word "gentleness" has come to be associated with softness and fragility – but there is no virtue that requires greater strength. As one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit, gentleness disposes us to receive the inspirations of the Spirit, who "reveals to men who Jesus is" (CCC 152). In cultivating a spirit of gentleness, we more closely resemble Christ, who was unfailingly gentle, even in the face of violence and death.

"Every virtue is a good thing, but most of all gentleness and meekness," said St. John Chrysostom. "This shows us men; this makes us to differ from wild beasts; this fits us to vie with Angels."






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¡Amar empieza por no hacer el mal y sigue por hacer el bien, como Jesús!

PALABRA QUE DA LA VIDA

Os lo aseguro: Si no sois mejores que los escribas y fariseos, no entraréis en el Reino de los Cielos.” (Mt 5, 20-22a)

El término “fariseo” está tan desprestigiado que nos resulta difícil comprender lo que quería decir Jesús cuando ponía esa comparación e invitaba a sus discípulos a ser mejores que ellos. En realidad, en aquella época los fariseos eran los más religiosos, observantes y fieles defensores de Dios. Si tuviéramos que buscar un equivalente, diríamos que eran los de “misa diaria”; esta comparación no es justa e incluso es ofensiva en sí misma, pero nos sirve para entender que los apóstoles estaban siendo invitados a ser mejores que los mejores de los judíos. Pero ¿mejores en qué?

Desde luego no se trataba de ser más puntilloso y exigente en cuestiones litúrgicas o en asuntos rituales (descanso del sábado, reglas culinarias, impuestos al templo, etc.). Lo que Jesús quería era que se superara por arriba la limitación que mantenía encorsetado el corazón del buen judío, del fariseo. Ciertamente, esto sólo lo pudieron entender bien los apóstoles al final de la vida de Cristo (cuando, en la Última Cena, les da el mandamiento nuevo) y, sobre todo, después de la venida del Espíritu Santo. Pero ya entonces pudieron comprender algo de lo que el Señor quería enseñarles. Para Jesús no se trataba de quedarse contento con no hacer el mal o con cumplir las leyes; lo que Él pedía a sus seguidores es que fueran más allá, que hicieran todo el bien posible, que no se quedaran satisfechos hasta que no hubieran ayudado al prójimo con todas sus fuerzas. 


