## Cathedral dedication stone visits area parishes blessed by Pope Francis; touring diocese

**KNOXVILLE---** It weighs just 19.5 pounds, and is roughly the size of an ordinary ceiling tile, but a granite slab mined from property in East Tennessee symbolizes the Diocese of Knoxville's connection with Pope Francis and the universal Catholic Church.

The dedication stone that will one day be placed inside the new Cathedral of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is making a pilgrimage across the diocese. Its next visits are:

Feb. 11-12: St. Patrick Catholic Church, 2518 W. Andrew Johnson Highway, Morristown, TN 37814

Feb. 25-26: Holy Trinity Catholic Church, 475 N. Highway 92, Jefferson City, TN 37760

March 4-5: Church of the Good Shepherd, 2361 Cosby Highway, Newport, 37822

The cathedral dedication stone was carried to Rome in 2015 by Bishop Richard F. Stika of the Diocese of Knoxville. He was accompanied by Cardinal Justin A. Rigali. The stone was blessed by Pope Francis on Oct. 14, 2015, at the Vatican.

While the stone visits area Catholic churches, it will be displayed in a wooden case along with a photo of the blessing by Pope Francis and a short history, reflection, and prayer.

The stone will visit all 51 parishes and mission churches, and all 10 schools in the Diocese of Knoxville before being placed in the cathedral before its dedication on March 3, 2018.
