Lenten Reflection - Week 4

Today's Gospel reveals the story of Jesus' encounter with a man who had been blind since birth. Jesus told his followers "I am the light of the world" and then transformed that metaphor into a reality by bringing sight to a man that was born into physical darkness. The man of John's parable is healed and his conversion to discipleship begins. He comes to a greater understanding about who Jesus is and what it means to believe in Him and to blindly follow Him

This parable invites us to focus on the spiritual aspects of darkness and light. We often suffer from spiritual blindness by our inability to see the work of God all around us. We live in a world of confusing times and darkness of sin. Somehow, when it is darkest, through faith, Jesus' light guides us.

If we choose to follow Christ and His light, which will brighten our faith and restore our spiritual vision, then we will see as God sees. Let us trust in Him and pursue the light He offers so that we may have eternal life.
