

Queridos feligreses,

Hoy es el catorceavo domingo del tiempo ordinario. La Liturgia habla acerca de la misión del Profeta, comenzando con la misión de Jesucristo. En Su propia ciudad natal la gente no lo aceptó, a pesar de que escucharon con qué autoridad habló, y de los milagros que había hecho con la hija de Jairo, y la curación de la mujer con una hemorragia (cfr Mc 5,21-43). Se negaron a creer que alguien que habían visto crecer, de su propia ciudad, podría tener una misión divina. Jesús estaba asombrado por su falta de fe y no podía hacer grandes señales allí. Eran como el pueblo obstinado y rebelde del Antiguo Testamento (Ez.2,2-5), a quien Dios envió al profeta Ezequiel. Es un denominador común, hay personas tercas que no aceptarán el mensaje de los Profetas, así como hay personas abiertas y dóciles a las palabras del Profeta. Esto ayuda a mantener al Profeta humilde al igual que sus propias debilidades, como diría San Pablo: " Así pues, de buena gana prefiero gloriarme de mis debilidades, para que se manifieste en mí el poder de Cristo" (2 Corintios 12,9). Oremos por nuestros sacerdotes y almas consagradas que también se encuentran con obstáculos y aceptación. Del mismo modo, cada uno de nosotros está llamado a ser mensajeros del Evangelio con los que nos rodean. Estamos llamados a ser valientes, y a estar dispuestos a sufrir persecución por el bien del Evangelio y de Jesús. ¿Estamos preparados?

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the 14th Sunday of Ordinary time. The Liturgy speaks about the mission of the Prophet, starting with the mission of Jesus Christ. In His own hometown the people did not accept him, even though they heard with what authority He spoke, and of the miracles He had done with the daughter of Jairus, and the healing of the woman with a hemorrhage (cfr Mk 5:21-43). They refused to believe that someone that they had seen grown up, from their own town, could have a divine mission. Jesus was amazed at their lack of faith and could not do any great signs there. They were like the obstinate, rebellious people of the Old Testament (Ez.2,2-5), to whom God sent the prophet Ezequiel. It is a common denominator, there are stubborn people who will not accept the message of the Prophets, as well as there are open and docile people to the words of the Prophet. This helps keep the Prophet humble as do his or her own weaknesses, as St. Paul would say: "I will rather boast most gladly of my weaknesses, in order that the power of Christ may dwell with me." (2 Cor. 12:9) Let us pray for our priests and consecrated souls who also meet with obstacles and acceptance. Likewise, each one of us is called to be messengers of the Gospel with those around us. We are called to be brave, and to be willing to suffer persecution for the sake of the Gospel and of Jesus. Are we ready?

Saint Maria Goretti (July 6)



Born into a poor peasant family of six children at the end of the 19th century in Italy, Maria Goretti's life was difficult from the beginning. Her family worked as farm hands and the children had to help feed the family as well. Halfway through her short, saintly life, Maria's father died of malaria. For some time the family had been working in the fields with another family named Serenelli. Now Maria's mother had to work in the fields in place of her deceased husband and left Maria to take care of the smaller children. She prayed a rosary every night for the repose of her father's soul and was noted for her piety and virtue by many of those around her. In 1902, after many advances on Maria, all of which she rejected, Alessandro Serenelli, a 19 year old farm hand, locked her into a room and tried to force himself upon her. She refused, fighting and warning him that he was committing a sin and that he would go to hell. Enraged, he then strangled her and stabbed her fourteen times. She was rushed to hospital when they found her bleeding to death from her wounds and she survived

for two agonizing days before dying. In hospital she was asked if she forgave Alessandro, and she replied "Yes, for the love of Jesus I forgive him...and I want him to be with me in Paradise." Alessandro was sentenced to prison for 30 years. One day, eight years into his prison term, he had a vison of a young girl dressed in white gathering lilies in a garden. She smiled, came near Alessandro and encouraged him to accept the lilies. Each lily he took transformed into a still white flame. Then Maria disappeared. This vision led to the conversion of Alessandro who repented deeply of what he had done. Maria Goretti is a patron saint of girls, rape victims, children and youth in general.
