

Palabras de Nuestro Vicario Parroquial

Queridos feligreses,

Hoy celebramos el Segundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Las lecturas de hoy nos hablan de la presencia de María en las bodas de Caná. También habla sobre el amor de Dios a su pueblo Israel, que es como el amor de un esposo por su novia. En el Evangelio vemos a María en las bodas de Caná. Ella acompaña a su hijo Jesús y a los Apóstoles en esta hermosa experiencia humana del matrimonio. En la Palabra de Dios, el plan de Dios para el matrimonio está lleno de gozo. En Efesios 5:25, San Pablo dice: "Esposos, amen a sus esposas, como Cristo amó a la Iglesia y se entregó a sí mismo por ella", En Génesis 2:18, el Señor Dios dijo: "No es bueno que el hombre esté solo; Lo haré un ayudante adecuado para él". En Proverbios 18:22, escuchamos: "Encontrar una esposa es encontrar la felicidad, un favor concedido por el Señor". Nosotros en la Iglesia ahora tomamos el lugar de Israel. Lo que dijo Isaías es igual de válido para nosotros hoy. La Iglesia es la novia, Jesús es el novio. La boda ha terminado porque Jesús está en el cielo de nuevo, pero el matrimonio de Dios con la humanidad continúa todos los días. Que cada día sea para nosotros un día de amar a nuestro novio, Jesús, a cambio de su amor por nosotros. En Isaías 62: 4-5, Dios dice: "No te llamarán más 'Abandonada', ni a tu tierra 'Desolada', sino que te llamarán 'Mi preferida' y a tu tierra 'Desposada'. Porque Dios se complacerá en ti y tu tierra tendrá un esposo. Como un joven se casa con una muchacha virgen, así el que te reconstruyó se casará contigo, y como el esposo goza con su esposa, así harás las delicias de tu Dios." La Santísima Virgen María, Reina del Cielo y Madre de Dios, nos enseña hoy cómo seguir a Cristo, cómo llegar a ser un cristiano maduro. Escuchamos las palabras pronunciadas por la Santísima Virgen María en el Evangelio de Juan. "Haz lo que él te diga". (Jn 2,5). María no habla a menudo en las Sagradas Escrituras, pero cada vez que habla, sus palabras rebosan de sabiduría. El Espíritu Santo llenó de alegría a María y a José después de la Anunciación, y a partir de entonces, dedicó toda su vida a servir a Jesús y contribuir a su misión, en su matrimonio con José y en la formación de una familia. Mientras continuamos con esta Misa, pidámosle que interceda por nosotros, tal como lo hizo por los recién casados en Caná, para que incluso cuando parezca que no nos queda vino en nuestros corazones, la gracia de Dios todavía fluya libremente en nosotros y a través de nosotros, llenándonos de alegría a pesar de las pruebas de la vida cotidiana. Amemos y acerquémonos a la Santísima Virgen María, porque ella nos muestra el camino a Cristo.





From our Parochial Vicar

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday in Ordinary time. The readings today speak to us about the presence of Mary in the marriage at Cana. It also speaks about the love of God to His people Israel which is like the love of a husband for his bride. In the Gospel we see Mary at the wedding of Cana. She is accompanying her son Jesus, and the Apostles in this beautiful human experience of marriage. In the Word of God, God's plan for marriage is full of joy. In Ephesians 5:25, St Paul says: "Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her," In Genesis 2:18, the Lord God said: "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper fit for him." In Proverbs 18:22, we hear: " To find a wife is to find happiness, a favor granted by the Lord." We in the Church now take the place of Israel. What Isaiah said is just as valid for us today. The Church is the bride, Jesus is the groom. The wedding is over because Jesus is in heaven again, but the marriage of God with humanity continues every day. May every day be for us a day of loving our groom, Jesus, in return for his love for us. In Isaiah 62: 4-5, God says: "No more shall people call you 'Forsaken", or your land 'Desolate', but you shall be called 'My Delight', and your land 'Espoused'. For the Lord delights in you and makes your land his spouse. As a young man marries a virgin, your Builder shall marry you; and as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you." The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Queen of Heaven and Mother of God, is teaching us today how to follow Christ, how to become a mature Christian. We hear the words uttered by the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Gospel of John. "Do whatever he tells you." (Jn 2:5). Mary does not speak often in the Sacred Scriptures, but every time she does speak, her words overflow with wisdom. The Holy Spirit filled Mary and Joseph with joy after the Annunciation, and from then on, she dedicated her entire life to serving Jesus and contributing to his mission, in her marriage to Joseph and in forming a family. As we continue with this Mass, let us ask her to intercede on our behalf, just as she did for the newlyweds at Cana, so that even when we do not seem to have any wine left in our hearts, God's grace will still flow freely in us and through us, filling us with joy despite the trials of everyday life. Let us love and grow closer to the Blessed Virgin Mary, because she shows us the way to Christ. Fr. Dennis Venegas



SAINT OF THE DAY -

St. Agnes - January 21 - Patron: of young girls, chastity, rape survivors, and the Children of Mary. St. Agnes born in 291 AD and raised in a Christian family. Agnes was very beautiful and belonged to a wealthy family. Her hand in marriage was highly sought after. However,

Agnes made a promise to God never to stain her purity. Her love for the Lord was great and she hated sin even more than death! Whenever a man wished to marry Agnes, she would always say, "Jesus Christ is my only Spouse. "According to legend, the young men she turned away became so angry and insulted by her devotion to God and purity that they began to submit her name to authorities as a Christian follower. In great anger, Procop accused her of being a Christian and brought her to his father, the Governor. The Governor promised Agnes wonderful gifts if she would only deny God, but Agnes refused. He tried to change her mind by putting her in chains, but her lovely face shone with joy. At last, she was condemned to death. Even the pagans cried to see such a young and beautiful girl going to death. She did not pay attention to those who begged her to save herself. "I would offend my Spouse," she said, "if I were to try to please you. He chose me first and He shall have me!" Then she prayed and bowed her head for the death-stroke of the sword. She died a virgin-martyr at the age of 12 or 13 on 21 January 304. She is often represented with a lamb, the symbol of her virgin innocence, and a palm branch, like other martyrs. She is shown as a young girl in robes holding a palm branch with the lamb her feet or in her arms.
