

#### Palabras de Nuestro Vicario Parroquial

Queridos feligreses,

Hoy celebramos el 5º domingo en el tiempo ordinario. La liturgia nos invita a confiar en Jesús y en su gracia para ser fieles a nuestra vocación de cristianos. Hoy vemos en la primera lectura (Is.6,1-2<sup>a</sup>,3-8) cómo Isaías es llamado por Dios a ser su profeta. En el principio, Isaías no se siente digno de estar en la presencia de Dios diciendo: "Estoy condenado", pero al final de la lectura Isaías está listo. Él dice: "Aquí estoy. ¡Envíame!" En el Evangelio de hoy (Lc.5,1-11), Jesús le dice a Simón que salga una corta distancia en el lago y que eche las redes para una pesca. Para Simón esto no parecía lógico ya que había estado pescando toda la noche y atrapó nada. Sintió que era un pescador experto, pero obedeció a Jesús y volvió a subir al bote y se alejó a una corta distancia. Tiraron las redes y tuvieron una gran captura. Las redes estaban llenas de peces que los barcos estaban en el punto de hundimiento. Simon se arrodilló sintiendo su indignidad. Jesús le dice: "No tengas miedo. De ahora en adelante serás pescador de hombres" y, dejándolo todo, siguieron a Jesús. Nuestro Señor nos invita al comenzar este nuevo año a tirar nuestras redes para la captura, a pesar de que en el último año, nuestros esfuerzos no fueron tan fructíferos como hubiéramos deseado. Debemos tirar nuestras redes para la captura en nuestra vida espiritual y en nuestras metas que están de acuerdo con la voluntad de Dios y el Señor estará con nosotros para ayudar a que nuestros esfuerzos sean fructíferos. San Pablo en la segunda lectura dice que ha trabajado más duro que nadie, pero aclara: "Sin embargo, la gracia de Dios está conmigo" (1 Corintios 15,10). Jesús nos encontrará donde estemos. Él sólo nos invita a dar pequeños pasos para convertirnos en buenos cristianos y fieles seguidores de Jesús. Nuestros esfuerzos con Él no fracasarán. Los frutos serán desbordados. Pidamos a la Santísima Virgen María que nos ayude a tirar nuestras redes para la pesca, para lograr buenos hábitos en nuestra vida cristiana y en nuestras metas de vida con la confianza de que Dios está con nosotros en cada paso del camino. #### From our Parochial Vicar

Dear parishioners,

Today we celebrate the 5th Sunday in ordinary time. The liturgy invites us to trust in Jesus and in His grace that we may be faithful to our vocation as Christians. Today we see in the first reading how Isaiah is called by God to be his prophet. In the beginning Isaiah does not feel worthy to be in God's presence saying: "I am doomed", but by the end of the reading Isaiah is ready. He says: "Here I am. Send me!" In today's Gospel, Jesus tells Simon to go out a short distance in the lakev and to lower the nets for a catch. To Simon this did not seem logical since he had been fishing all night and did not catch anything. He felt that he was an expert fisherman, but he obeyed Jesus and he got back into the boat and put out a short distance. They threw out the nets and had a huge catch. The Nets were full of fish that the boats were at sinking point. Simon kneels down feeling his unworthiness. Jesus says: "Do not be afraid. From now on you will be catching men" and when they followed Jesus. Our Lord invites us as we begin this new year to throw out our nets for the catch, even though in the past year, our efforts were not as fruitful as we would have desired. We should throw out our nets for the catch in our spiritual life and in our goals that are according to God's will and the Lord will be with us to help our efforts to be fruitful. St Paul in the second reading says that he has toiled harder than anyone else but he clarifies: "However the grace of God is with me"(1 Cor.15,10). Jesus will meet us where we are. He only invites us to take baby steps toward becoming good Christians and faithful followers of Jesus. Our efforts with him will not fail. The fruits will be overflowing. Let us ask the Blessed Virgin Mary to help us to throw out our nets for the catch, in achieving good habits in our Christian life and in our life goals with confidence that God is with us every step

#### **SAINT OF THE DAY -**

OUR LADY OF LOURDES is a Roman Catholic title of the Mary, mother of Jesus, venerated in honor of the Marian apparitions that occurred in Lourdes, France. The first apparition of 11 February 1858, of

which Bernadette Soubirous (age 14) told her mother that a "Lady" spoke to her in the cave of Massabielle while she was gathering firewood with her sister and a friend. Similar apparitions of the "Lady" were reported on 18 occasions that year, until the climax revelation of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception took place. On 18 January 1862, the local Bishop of Tarbes Bertrand-Sévère Laurence endorsed the veneration of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Lourdes, on 11 February 1858, As I raised my head to look at the grotto, I saw a lady dressed in white, wearing a white dress, a blue girdle and a yellow rose on each foot, the same color as the chain of her rosary; the beads of the rosary were white....From the niche, or rather alcove behind it, came a dazzling light...". Soubirous tried to make the sign of the cross but could not, as her hands were trembling. The lady smiled, and invited Soubirous to pray the rosary with her. The next day, she said the apparition asked her to dig in the ground and drink from the spring she found there. This made her disheveled and some of her supporters were dismayed, but this act revealed the stream that soon became a focal point for pilgrimages. Although it was muddy at first, the stream became increasingly clean. . On 18 January 1860, the local bishop finally declared that: "The Virgin Mary did appear indeed to Bernadette Soubirous. These events established the Marian veneration in Lourdes, and is one of the most frequented Marian shrines in the world to which between 4 and 6 million pilgrims travel annually.
