

Reflection on the Liturgy of the Word

Reading: (Lk 18,1-8)

"They cry to him day and night" and "he will give them justice without delay." The Lord gives "to each according to his ability" and need. We must pray and ask, and also accept what He gives.

Meditation:

Pray always. Prayer also has a therapeutic purpose, it helps moral and psychological resilience; praying is an exercise that heals inwardly, it keeps the troubled, restless, depressed and sad soul with signs of life and warmth; that is why Jesus speaks of "praying always and not becoming discouraged". The didactic example of the widow and the judge develops it with primness and persuasive efficacy. The important thing is to pray, not to cease in this effort, because one cannot pray in vain. One learns to pray by praying, but one must do it. (Cardinal Óscar R. Maradiaga)

Prayer:

Our prayer should not expect from the Lord more than what we really need. You will see how the Lord does not disappoint those who trust in Him.

Action:

When they need you, let them not "cry out day and night," answer "without delay."

SAINT OF THE DAY

SAINT TERESA OF JESUS (1515-1582) October 15

Let nothing disturb you; let nothing frighten you. Gifted with a passionate spirit, young Teresa dreamed of converting Muslims and becoming a martyr. All things are passing; God never changes. But

her mother's death when Teresa was fourteen inspired lifelong devotion to Our Lady, and Teresa entered the Carmelites, Mary's order, despite her father's objections and her own fragile health. Patience gains everything. Initially, she enjoyed her lax convent's sociability and "busyness," but mystical prayer and John of the Cross' collaboration inspired her to reform the Carmelites. Whoever has God, lacks nothing. When her ideals encountered resistance and brought suffering, she maintained her peace--and humor. Discovered devouring leftovers, she told her mildly scandalized nuns, "When I fast, I fast! When I eat, I eat!" To nuns demanding less work and more prayer in the convent schedule, she retorted: "What we really need around here are fewer starry eyes and more strong arms!" God alone is enough! The her "Breviary italicized sentences here are Bookmark," the simple, profound prayer of Teresa, the first woman Doctor of the Church.

Mass Intentions Update



Reflexion sobre la Liturgia de la Palabra

Lectura: (Lc 18,1-8)

Meditación:

Orar siempre. La oración tiene también una finalidad terapéutica, ayuda a la resiliencia moral y psicológica; orar es un ejercicio que sana interiormente, mantiene con signos de vida y calor el alma perturbada, inquieta, deprimida y triste; por eso Jesús habla de «orar siempre y no desanimarse». El ejemplo didáctico de la viuda y el juez lo desarrolla con primor y eficacia persuasiva. Lo importante es orar, no cejar en ese empeño, pues no se puede orar vanamente. A orar se aprende orando, pero hay que hacerlo.(Card. Óscar R. Maradiaga)
