

Reflection on the Liturgy of the Word

READING (Mt, 1-12a)

Climbing the mountain is the typical expression that the moment is fundamental, transcendental, very important. What an ecological and marvelous setting Jesus chooses to proclaim the beatitudes, surrounded by the disciples to whom he addresses himself, and in them, all his disciples and followers throughout time and history. We can say that the beatitudes are like the essence of the Gospel, like the magna carta of the disciple of Jesus, like the road map that he gives to his followers, like the milestones that indicate the way, seeing and observing the sure signs so as not to make a mistake on the way, and if he makes a mistake by looking for shortcuts, to turn around and find the true path again.

MEDITATION

I invite you, and I invite myself and all of you, to meditate on this fundamental text of the Beatitudes, to interiorize it and chew it well and carefully. We can do this frequently and slowly. Here are the essences of the Gospel. The evangelist Matthew has compiled them and offers them to us in this chapter 5. With that expression "Blessed are those who..." he makes explicit and unpacks the vital attitudes of his disciples, of his followers, at that moment and always.

PRAYER

Lord, allow us, seated at your feet, to listen well and engrave your beatitudes in our hearts. May they direct and guide our steps towards you, who are the way, the truth and the life, that we may know how to follow you with fidelity and enthusiasm, in the midst of so many brothers and sisters. There are many things that distract us and lead us astray, seeking shortcuts. Return us once and a thousand times to the way of the beatitudes. Thank you, Lord!

Saint of the Day - February 3 - Saint Blaise

We know more about the devotion to Saint Blaise by Christians around the world than we know about the saint himself. His feast is observed as a holy day in some Eastern Churches. In 1222, the Council of Oxford prohibited servile labor in England on Blaise's feast day. The Germans and Slavs hold him in special honor, and for decades many United States Catholics have sought the annual Saint Blaise blessing for their throats. We know that Bishop Blaise was martyred in his episcopal city of

Sebastea, Armenia, in 316. The legendary Acts of St. Blaise were written 400 years later. According to them Blaise was a good bishop, working hard to encourage the spiritual and physical health of his people. Although the Edict of Toleration (311), granting freedom of worship in the Roman Empire, was already five years old, persecution still raged in Armenia. Blaise was apparently forced to flee to the back country. There he lived as a hermit in solitude and prayer, but he made friends with the wild animals. One day a group of hunters seeking wild animals for the amphitheater stumbled upon Blaise's cave. They were first surprised and then frightened. The bishop was kneeling in prayer surrounded by patiently waiting wolves, lions and bears. The legend has it that as the hunters hauled Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command the child was able to cough up the bone .Agricolaus, governor of Cappadocia, tried to persuade Blaise to sacrifice to pagan idols. The first time Blaise refused, he was beaten. The next time he was suspended from a tree and his flesh torn with iron combs or rakes. Finally, he was beheaded. Blaise is seen as one more example of the power those have who give themselves entirely to Jesus. As Jesus told his apostles at the Last Supper, "If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you" (John 15:7). 
MEDITATIO
