
The private celebration of the Sunday 5:30 PM Mass is suspended until further notice.


Weekend Mass is celebrated at 100% capacity and masks are <u>required</u>. The Day Chapel will be reserved for those who wish to maintain social distancing




The Confession line begins in the Community Center which is located south of the main entrance of the church.





The Parish Budget for Fiscal Year 2022 (7/1/21 - 6/30/22) is based on the giving of our faith family for Fiscal Year 2022. The portion of our budget contributed in envelopes, checks and loose cash is \$1,768,000.00 or \$34,000.00 per week. Contributions for the 17th weekend of the fiscal year were \$30,112.00. In the 17th week of our fiscal year, our budgeted goal for ministry programs and ordinary operating expenses is \$578,000.00, and our collections are \$544,785.00. Our collection for Catholic Charities was: \$2,916.00. Thank you for your continuing generosity.

PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Our Lady of the Annunciation Roman Catholic Parish is a people of living faith rooted in the Gospel, centered on the Eucharist and led by the Holy Spirit. We are inspired by the example of Mary to continue the mission of Jesus Christ by ministering to all.

31ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's theme in the liturgy is the greatest command of God. In MK 12:29, Jesus quotes Deut. 6:4-5 which says: Hear oh Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. Then Jesus adds a quote from Lv.19:18 which says: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. It is in the union of these two texts that Jesus teaches that when we love our neighbor we are actually



loving God as well. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1823) teaches: Jesus makes charity the new commandment. By loving his own "to the end" he makes manifest the Father's love which he receives. By loving one another, the disciples imitate the love of Jesus which they themselves receive. Whence Jesus says: "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you, abide in my love." And again: "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." We would all do well to make a good examination of our charity toward God and toward neighbor in our day to day lives. Then, let us ask God for mercy in our failures and for the grace to grow in charity in the days ahead.

ALL SAINTS DAY AND ALL SOULS DAY



We will celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints Day on Monday, Nov. 1st. The Masses for the feast day will be at 8:30 a.m., 10:30 a.m. school Mass and 5:30 p.m. While it is not obligatory this year, please join us as we call to mind our true vocation from baptism, the call to holiness for every one of us, modeled

for us by those who have been canonized and declared saints by the Church. We also celebrate those holy souls whom we have known who have been witnesses to the love of God and neighbor but have yet to be officially canonized. On Tuesday, Nov. 2nd, we will celebrate the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed, better known as All Souls Day, at the 8:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. Masses. With the 5:30 p.m. Mass you are invited to bring pictures of your loved ones to be placed near the altar for remembrance in our service. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.

Please mark your schedules and calendars accordingly. See you back in Ordinary Time!


POLITICAL RESPECT
