SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL

Today the Church throughout the world celebrates the Solemn Feast of the Apostles Peter and Paul. We commemorate their martyrdom in Rome as witnesses unto death of the saving gospel of Jesus Christ. These two men could not have been more different—one a fisherman, the other a scholar of Israel. Yet, Jesus chose them both in order to reach different people. As we celebrate our liberty, let us remember that St. Paul teaches liberty is given as an opportunity to serve one another out of love and not as an excuse for self-indulgence (cf. Gal. 5:13). Here follows a prayer of our first President George Washington that you may wish to use:

Grant our supplication, we beseech Thee, through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.
