

The Parish Budget for Fiscal Year 2025 (7/1/25 - 6/30/26) is based on the giving of our faith family for Fiscal Year 2025. The portion of our budget contributed in envelopes, checks, loose cash and online giving is \$1,891,760.00 or \$36,380.00 per week.

Contributions for the 5th weekend of the fiscal year were \$23,440.00. In the 5th week of our fiscal year, our budgeted goal for ministry programs and ordinary operating expenses were \$181,900.00, and our collections are \$159,664.00.

From the Pastor

19th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Letter to the Hebrews 11:1 teaches us that: Faith is confident assurance about things hoped for and conviction about things we do not see. When we look at Jesus' teachings in LK 12: 32-48, it is clear that He is calling us to vigilance in faith and charity in a world that is consumed with earthly things. For Jesus said: ...Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be. Jesus also uses the analogy of servants awaiting their master's return with lighted lamps Are the lamps of our souls lit by the Holy Spirit with love for God and neighbor? We do not know when the Lord will return for us but we do know that He will return. Jesus concludes the teaching with an important challenge for us in LK 12:48 by saying: Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more. Let us not become slackers with the graces, talents and blessings we have received, but rather never delay in bearing good fruit serving the Lord whenever we see the need.

CATHOLIC CHARITIES COLLECTION



We will take up the annual collection for our local Catholic Charities in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe next weekend. In addition, their Center for Community Involvement coordinates over 15,000 volunteer hours a year! Please do what you can to help Catholic Charities continue its work of making the gospel come alive with faith in action among those most in need in our community.


