The Parish Budget for Fiscal Year 2025 (7/1/25 - 6/30/26) is based on the giving of our faith family for Fiscal Year 2025. The portion of our budget contributed in envelopes, checks, loose cash and online giving is \$1,891,760.00 or \$36,380.00 per week. Contributions for the 14th weekend of the fiscal year were \$37,434.00. In the 14th week of our fiscal year, our budgeted goal for ministry programs and ordinary operating expenses were \$509,320.00, and our collections are \$474,820.00.


TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The psalmist reminds us in Psalm 50:14 to: Offer God a sacrifice of thanksgiving. Today the gospel speak to us about gratitude and ingratitude. Jesus worked many miracles of healing but how many actually thanked him? There are so many things we ask of God but do we give thanks to the Lord for the gifts we have already received? Do we begin the day by thanking the Lord for a new day and the opportunity to spread a little more of God's goodness around the world?



When Jesus healed the ten lepers, LK 17:11-19, only one foreigner returned to give him thanks. Oh what a difference an attitude of gratitude can make in our life and in those around us. The Mass itself is a celebration of the Eucharist, from the Greek word meaning giving thanks. Let us beseech the Lord for a spirit of gratitude for the many blessings we receive from God each day. The Catechism of the Catholic Church # 2637 puts it this way: Thanksgiving characterizes the prayer of the Church which, in celebrating the Eucharist, reveals and becomes more fully what she is. Indeed, in the work of salvation, Christ sets creation free from sin and death to consecrate it anew and make it return to the Father, for his glory. The thanksgiving of the members of the body participates in that of their Head.

7 THEMES OF CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING



The Church expresses its Catholic social teaching through 7 principles: 1. Respect the Human Person, 2. Promote the Family, 3. Protect Rights and Responsibilities, 4. Work for the Common Good with an eye to the Poor and Vulnerable 5. Respect Work and the Worker, 6. Practice Solidarity and Subsidiarity, 7. Be Stewards of Creation. All of these themes begin with the foundation of the first principle of respecting the dignity of the human person. In his classic work,

Centesimus Annus #11, St. John Paul stated that the foundation of Catholic social teaching “is a correct view of the human person and of his unique value, inasmuch as man is the only creature on earth which God willed for itself. God has imprinted his own image and likeness on man (cf. Gen. 1:26), conferring upon him incomparable dignity.” Based on this dignity we see the right to life as the foundational right without which we can enjoy no other rights. This is why we must take this right into account before all others when we make decisions for our selves, our families, our community and beyond. When we go to the ballot box, for example, we must consider how our choices affect the dignity of every person—from the pre-born child to the fragile elder in hospice care and everyone in between. What a difference we can make for the good of society once we begin to live by the principles of Catholic Social Teaching.
