The Parish Budget for Fiscal Year 2025 (7/1/25 - 6/30/26) is based on the giving of our faith family for Fiscal Year 2025. The portion of our budget contributed in envelopes, checks, loose cash and online giving is \$1,891,760.00 or \$36,380.00 per week.

Contributions for the 15th weekend of the fiscal year were \$35,835.00. In the 15th week of our fiscal year, our budgeted goal for ministry programs and ordinary operating expenses were \$545,700.00, and our collections are \$510,730.00.



From the Pastor

29TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The theme for today's liturgy is perseverance in prayer. In Luke Chapter 18, Jesus uses the parable of the widow who kept after a godless judge for a just decision which he eventually gave her in order to get rid of her persistent nagging! Well, if this judge would give in, how much more will the Lord, who is the just Judge, attend to our persistent prayers. Unfortunately, many give up on prayer after a short time, not realizing that God answers us in different ways and in various times. Our ongoing prayer stretches our hearts like wineskins in order to be more open to God's answers. Sometimes, like Moses with Aaron and Hur in Exodus 17:8-13, we need prayer partners to encourage us and hold us up in our supplications to God. The psalmist reminds us that "Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth", Psalm 121:2. St. Paul points out to St. Timothy, in 2 Tm. 3:14-4:2, that we should search the scriptures which are inspired by God for true wisdom.



Reading, meditating and prayer over the Word of God is one of my favorite ways to spend time with the Lord and to discover the treasures God has for us in the scriptures. Perhaps you might consider joining one of our scripture study groups to help draw you further into the Divine Word. Jesus poses a troubling question at the end of today's gospel in LK 18:8 when He asks "When the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on earth?" If we give up on prayer and do not persevere, our faith will diminish and the answer will be no! In the month of the Holy Rosary, I once again encourage every person and every family to pray the rosary daily for conversion of hearts, for an end to violence in our city and for peace on earth.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY



Today we celebrate Mission Sunday throughout the world as Catholics. This is the day in which we reflect upon the mission that Jesus gave his first followers recorded in MT 28:19-20 to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am

with you always, to the end of the ages." Some of us are called to travel to the ends of the earth, like our Canossian Sisters, to evangelize and others are called to pray for their missions and support them with our resources. Whatever we do, we can all partner in some way with the priests, sisters, brothers and lay catechists who are serving in village missions, small schools, medical outposts, orphanages, refugee camps and crowded cities throughout Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands and remote regions of Latin America. As we are all one Body in Christ, we are tied together as a worldwide family in need of love and support. There is a growing movement of Catholic lay missionaries, like the Family Mission Company in Abbeville, Louisiana, which need our support for their efforts as individuals, couples and families who dedicate their lives to bringing the good news of the gospel to the ends of the earth. While we must bring the gospel message to our local community by the witness of our own lives, let us support those who are willing to give up everything here in order to reach those who have yet to hear the good news around the world. Let us pray for the success of the missionaries of hope among all people and contribute generously to the collection today.
