

How shall I make a return to the Lord for all the good He has done for me? (Psalm 116:12)

The Parish Budget for Fiscal Year 2025 (7/1/25 - 6/30/26) is based on the giving of our faith family for Fiscal Year 2025. The portion of our budget contributed in envelopes, checks, loose cash and online giving is \$1,891,760.00 or \$36,380.00 per week.

Contributions for the 19th weekend of the fiscal year were \$41,400.00. In the 19th week of our fiscal year, our budgeted goal for ministry programs and ordinary operating expenses were \$691,220.00, and our collections are \$646,352.00. Our collections for Archdiocese Military Services was: \$4,063.00.

From the Pastor

33RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

As we move toward the conclusion of the Liturgical Year, the Mass takes us into a meditation on the four last things: death, judgement, heaven and hell. In LK 21:5-19, Jesus teaches us about the final realities with a prophecy of the destruction of the great Temple of Jerusalem, which indeed happened over thirty years later in the year 70 A.D. under the Roman persecution of Israel. Some wondered if that would be the end of the world. Jesus points out that there would be many wars and natural disasters to come as well as many false



messiahs. In fact, we know that there would be some who would come claiming to be the return of Jesus himself! We must be cautious and discerning when it comes to such claims about the final coming as no one knows the day or the hour but God alone, cf. MT 24:36. If indeed our mission in life, from our baptismal vocation to holiness, is to know, love and serve the Lord in this life in order to be with God forever in the next life, then how shall we accomplish this? St. Paul makes it very clear in 2 Thess. 3:7-12 that we should all be working and busy about the Lord's business until the final day. Instead of being busybodies about other people's business, we must be diligent in our duties toward God, family and neighbor. We must become good stewards of our time, talent and treasure so as to make a good return to the Lord. In Mal. 3:19-20, the Lord points out through the Prophet Malachi that when the final day comes, for those of "...you who fear my Name, there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays." Let us seek to practice our faith both in private and in public so that when the Lord comes we will have no shame, but rather rejoice in the return of our Savior. As Jesus says to his followers about his own return in LK 21:28: "Now when things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near."

O Consuming Fire, Spirit of Love, descend into my soul and make all in me as an incarnation of the Word, that I may be to Him a super-added humanity wherein He renews his mystery; and You O Father, bestow Yourself and bend down to your little creature, seeing in her only your beloved Son in whom You are well pleased.

We meet in Support and Prayer on the 2nd Sunday at 2:00 PM at St. Bakhita Hall.


