# What is the Fall Harvest Basketball Tournament?

How does the tournament support all AMA sports?

- •What is the Paul Garlitz Jr. Fall Harvest Basketball Tournament? It is a tournament started in 2008 by St. Thomas More School to help raise funds to support the school's athletics program. It was renamed in 2010 after a beloved and highly-respected official in the league named Paul Garlitz Jr. passed away in March of that year. Paul was a Mt. Lebanon native who dedicated countless hours of his time to making elementary and high school sports better and he left a lasting impression on parents, student-athletes, and his fellow officials. After our merger in 2020, we decided to continue this highly successful and meaningful event.
- •We host 32 girls/boys' public & catholic teams over two weekends of amazing basketball with lots of great food and lots of great people!
- Little Peps & Little Dribblers perform half-time shows at one or more of the games.
- •Under the guidance of our school leadership, our athletics program is 100% volunteer-run and 100% financially independent we receive no financial support from the school or diocese. We rely heavily on the Fall Harvest Tournament for the extra funding needed to maintain and/or upgrade our facilities and programs and to keep our registration fees low. Though Fall Harvest is a basketball tournament, it supports ALL AMA SPORTS. General examples of what Fall Harvest helps to fund are below:
