SOW MUCH LOVE (Small family farmers feed the world)WHAT HAPPENED TO OUT SEEDS?



Over the past few decades, multinational corporations have taken increasing control over seeds. their seeds must not only be purchased and require expensive fertilizers and pesticides to grow, they can't be re-used. This means that farmers have to re-purchase these seeds each year, placing them in a cycle of dependence on the company. Farmers can incur massive debts that only continue to rise, especially if their crops fail. Corporations are patenting more and more seeds, which is making it increasingly difficult for farmers to access seeds. What was once a shared heritage of all farmers and part of the common good is gradually being privatized. As a result, farmers' rights are eroding, and seed diversity is disappearing at a rapid rate.



Thirty-Third Week of Ordinary Time

The **Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time** brings us the familiar and powerful parable from **Matthew's Gospel** about the servants who are each given sums of money to invest. We are all called upon to use the gifts we have received as gifts, and to return them, fully developed, having made the best use of them.

Monday is the Memorial of Saint Elizabeth of Hungary. Friday is the Memorial of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Saturday is the Memorial of Saint Cecilia, Virgin and Martyr.

During these last two weeks of **Ordinary Time**, the first reading is from the Book of **Revelation**, with its mystic imagery. Written for readers who were familiar with apocalyptic writings, the writings send a hidden message of salvation to the earliest communities of Christians, and to us.

Luke's Gospel continues with the story of the blind man who hails him, "Jesus, Son of David, have pity on me!" An unpopular tax collector, Zacchaeus, climbs a tree to get a glimpse of Jesus and is given personal recognition as Jesus says, "Zacchaeus, today I must stay at your house." Luke's version of the parable of the talents offers praise for the servant who has invested the ten coins and earned another ten. "Well done, good servant! You have been faithful in this very small matter; take charge of ten cities." In Jerusalem, Jesus weeps over the city, foreseeing the destruction that is coming, "because you did not recognize the time of your visitation." Jesus drives out the sellers from the temple while the chief priests plot against him. Religious leaders try to trap him with a trick question about a woman who marries seven brothers but Jesus refutes them.

Sunday is the Thirty-Fourth or Last Sunday in Ordinary Time and the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King. Jesus tells the marvelous parable about how we will all be judged - as a shepherd separates sheep from goats, based upon our care for the poor: "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me."
