Dear Friends

Sometimes I have found myself with people afraid of heights. I am not generally afraid of heights, but am always happier when there is a guard rail!

Having experienced the beauty of Chile from the height of the Andes, cebergs from the observation deck of a cruise ship, the beauty of the sea from the plateau of Santorini or the drive down into the Great Highland Way, I am well aware of the amazing and beautiful perspective that height provides.

The story of Jesus' Ascension is also our story. Where Jesus is, he wants us also to be, with his Father in heaven. So forty days after his resurrection, Jesus becomes a source of strength for the disciples. He encourages them by telling him that he would always be with them, in his Word, in the Eucharist, and through the Holy Spirit. With Jesus' work on earth complete, he returns to the Father. The disciples must now continue his work, telling others you and me - of the love and mercy of the Father, and that our home on earth is not our final destination, rather that our faith journey leads us on a path of ascension, aspiring to new heights, towards our true home in heaven, with God. . 



Listen to Jesus' final words to his disciples before ascending to his Father as recorded in Acts of the Apostles: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8).

Luke's Gospel account of the Ascension echoes Acts, "And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high" (Lk 24:49).

Paul reiterates Luke and Acts. Recall that Paul knew what it was like to live without this power. He himself experienced this power for the first time in his encounter with Jesus on his way to Damascus to persecute Christians. The "surpassing greatness of his power for us who believe" is the presence of the Holy Spirit!

Remember John's Last Supper discourse. Jesus attempts to comfort his followers even while predicting his departure, "But I tell you the truth, it is better for you that I go. For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you" (Jn 16:8).

Paul's Letter to the Galatians witnesses to the Fruits of the Spirit as he experienced them after his conversion: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.

And we are all familiar with the Sevenfold Gifts of the Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, knowledge, fortitude, piety, fear of the Lord.

As I struggle to express appropriately the insights for this reflection am I aware of the multiple gifts of the Spirit at work? Surely the Gifts of the Spirit: wisdom, counsel and knowledge. Surely the Fruits of the Spirit: love, generosity and patience.

Jesus has indeed fulfilled the promise he made to his disciples at the Last Supper! Now our daily lives are replete with the presence of the Spirit.

During this Post-Resurrection season we have a special invitation to pause and be grateful for this presence: "Behold I am with you always, even to the end of the age, alleluia" (Communion Antiphon).
