Day of Prayer for Palliative Care

All members are encouraged to support this endeavour by coming to spend some time in prayer during the day.

Palliative care refers to the specialized care of people who are dying that aims to relieve suffering and improve the quality of living and dying.

The need for palliative care in Canada continues to grow, yet it is still widely misunderstood. ARCH has put together some myths and facts to help dispel some of the misinformation.

## **MYTHS ABOUT PALLIATIVE CARE**

Myth: Palliative care is only for old people or people with cancer

Fact: All those who are diagnosed with chronic life-limiting illness can benefit from palliative care, regardless of age or illness.

Myth: We need to protect children from being exposed to death or dying

Fact: Death is an inescapable fact of life. Allowing children to talk about death and dying is important. By talking with then, you may discover what they know and do not know—if they have misconceptions, fears, or worries. You can then help them by providing needed information, comfort, and understanding.

Myth: Pain is part of dying. Everyone experiences it.

Fact: Pain is not always a part of dying. If pain is experienced near end-of-life, there are ways it can be alleviated. Talk with your palliative care team to learn about ways to reduce your pain.

Myth: Palliative care accelerates death.

Fact: Palliative care aims to neither prolong nor accelerate death but rather ensures quality of life until the very end.



#### Third Week of Easter

The **Third Week of Easter** begins with the disciples on the road to Emmaus. Then did not recognized him until the breaking of the bread. The gospels all week are about his being broken and given for us as Bread that Gives Life.

In our first readings from **Acts of the Apostles** this week, we read of Stephen, one of the earliest martyrs, and of Philip converting an Ethiopian slave along the road. Next is the story of Saul, persecutor of Christians being blinded and then healed by Ananias in the name of Jesus. The week ends with Peter traveling the region and healing.

The Gospel for this week is from Chapter 6 of **John's Gospel** on Jesus as the "Bread of Life." Like so many stories in this Gospel, Jesus teaches from one layer of understanding to another, taking us deeper into understanding his gift of himself to us in the Eucharist. Jesus says, "Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life." "The bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my Flesh for the life of the world." "Whoever eats my Flesh and drinks my Blood remains in me and I in him." This marvelous dialogue ends with this exchange with his disciples: "Jesus then said to the Twelve, 'Do you also want to leave?' Simon Peter answered him, 'Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God.'"

On the **Fourth Sunday of Easter**, in the gospel, Jesus tells us "I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved... I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."
