

The Eleventh Week of Ordinary Time

The week begins with **Trinity Sunday**, which always follows **Pentecost**. It celebrates the unknowable relationship between the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit - and their loving support for us in our lives.

On Thursday, most of the world will celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ, (Corpus Christi).

In the **Second Letter to the Corinthians**, Paul is defending himself. He tells the people of Corinth -- and us -- not to receive the grace of God in vain. Paul reminds them about generosity and cheerful giving. He begs the community not to dismiss him because of his poor speaking abilities saying, "Even if I am untrained in speaking, I am not so in knowledge." He boasts about his weakness, which he had at first begged to be freed from by the Lord, who said to him, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness."

In the **Sermon on the Mount** Jesus calls us beyond simply being legalistic. His message is not an "eye for an eye," but turning the other cheek, loving our enemies and praying for them. Jesus cautions us about performing good deeds for others to see. He teaches us to pray simply, because our Father knows what we need. "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and decay destroy, and thieves break in and steal.... For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." Focus on God, not the world: "No one can serve two masters... You cannot serve God

Next Sunday is **The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**. We have **Luke's Gospel** with powerful words of sacrifice and focus for our lives: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it."

Daily Prayer This Week

There is nothing like the Sermon on the Mount to help us hear the message of Jesus, and to let ourselves be addressed by those words. All of us can ask for the graces Jesus promises us - with real people and real daily circumstances in mind. We know with whom we need to "turn the other cheek" and to love more. We know the situations in which we are tempted to "be religious" in those circumstances only.

Upon reflection, each of us can take the time to "locate" our hearts, by discovering what we tend to treasure. How can we really know what we treasure? We can make a list of the "five most important things" in our lives. Then we make a list of the five things we spend most of our time on. Comparing the lists will help us get concrete about asking the Lord for the grace we need to put our lives back in balance. All of us can name what we worry about. And so we can all ask for the graces to "seek first" the Kingdom of God.

All of this reflection can happen throughout the week in the background of our daily life, if we get into the habit of focusing for a few moments each morning. If we take just 30 seconds, at the edge of our bed each morning, it will begin to establish a habit of living more reflectively.

Thank you for this day, Lord. Help me to be focused today on not getting so hooked by Mary's ways or Chris' harsh words. I need your grace to place my trust in you. Help me especially before I have to talk with Mary on the phone and let me stay focused before Chris comes home from work.

This version of a brief moment with the Lord - friend to friend - can be repeated and made more specific, while we are going about our days. Some days, we might have 20 such moments of prayerful conversation with our Lord - guided by the Word, the desires that are surfacing, and the events of our daily lives. And, each night, we can give thanks for this deeper relationship with the Lord that is developing in our hearts.

What is the Jubilee?

The Jubilee is a year-long, grace-filled time when we are called to reflect on our faith and renew our commitment to God and experience His mercy. It is also a moment of celebration and thanksgiving. The Jubilee is celebrated every 25 years. There have also been exceptional Jubilees outside of the usual cycle, such as the Jubilee of Mercy proclaimed by Pope Francis for 2015.

The concept of Jubilee can be found in the Old Testament as a time of special celebration every 50 years. This idea of a special holy year was picked up by Pope Boniface VIII, who declared the first Catholic Jubilee to commemorate the year 1300. At first this kind of Jubilee was supposed to be celebrated only every 100 years, but soon that was reduced to 50, and then in 1470, to 25.


