Exodus 22:20-26

The Lord said to Moses, ‘Tell the sons
of Israel this: “You must not molest
the stranger or oppress him, for you
lived as strangers in the land of Egypt.
You must not be harsh with the widow,
or with the orphan; if you are harsh
with them, they will surely cry out to
me, and be sure I shall hear their cry;
my anger will flare and I shall kill you
with the sword, your own wives will be
widows, your own children
orphans. “If you lend money to any
of my people, to any poor man among
you, you must not play the usurer with
him: you must not demand interest
from him. “If you take another’s cloak
as a pledge, you must give it back to
him before sunset. It is all the covering
