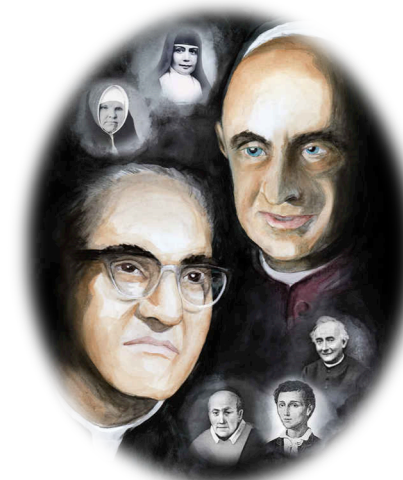
## CONSIDERING PRIMARY TEACHING?

## GOSPEL

*Mark 10:35-45*

to sit one at your right hand and the  
other at your left in your glory.' 'You  
do not know what you are asking'

the cup that I must drink, or be  
baptised with the baptism with which  
I must be baptised?' They replied,  
'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The  
cup that I must drink you shall drink,  
and with the baptism with which I  
must be baptised you shall be

hand or my left, these are not mine  
to grant; they belong to those to  
whom they have been allotted.'  
When the other ten heard this they  
began to feel indignant with James  
and John, so Jesus called them to
