
### LITURGY SCHEDULE THIS WEEK

Places are available for booking at all Masses this week (with the exception of Saturday 10.00 am Mass which is live streamed only).

In addition, Confession is available in the hall on **Thursday evening** from 6.00 pm until 6.45 pm

Novena to our Lady of Perpetual Succour is on Thursday at 6.45 and the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy is on Friday at 7.00 pm



The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated every second Saturday (to allow for the availability of volunteers).

Last year we were unable to celebrate the Sacraments of First Confession, First Holy Communion or Confirmation. Now that restrictions have eased slightly we would like to provide this opportunity.

Parents of children in P3 who have not yet made their First Confession, in P4 who have not yet made their First Holy Communion, or in P7 who have not yet received the Sacrament of Confirmation are kindly asked to contact Mgr Paul so that appropriate arrangements can be made.

Our thanks to those who have already been in touch. If your child falls in to one of these categories, please contact Mgr Paul as soon as possible this week.

### **CHANGES IN RESTRICTIONS**

You may have noticed that the Government recently lifted the 50 person cap in places of worship. However, since

2m physical distancing remains in place this will only really be a benefit to a few of our largest churches. In Saint Helen's our maximum number remains at 50 due to physical distancing. However, we are hopeful that things will relax a bit more in the not too distant future.

### **BOOKINGS FOR MASS**

We hope that the current procedures will soon come to an end, but at the moment we continue to have to operate our booking system to ensure that at least a limited number of people can attend Mass safely. Generally speaking this system has worked well - at most Masses the vast majority of the bookings are fulfilled with only one or two occasional "noshows". However, on Sunday 11th April at the 5.00 pm Mass, 7 people made bookings which they did not fulfil and then again on 18th April at the 5.00 pm Mass 10 people did not turn up. This is a significant number of places which could have been made available to others - you are reminded to please cancel your booking if it turns out that you are unable to fulfil it. This can be done through Eventbrite by returning to your original booking. If you encounter a difficulty with this, please email the parish with details of your cancellation so that the places can be made available to others.



Yet again I would like to express my enormous gratitude for your immense generosity to Saint Helen's. The end of our financial year was on 31st March and

we will soon produce our annual financial statement and be in a position to gauge the full financial impact of more than a vear of closures and restrictions. Preliminary figures show an inevitable drop in income compared to last year but we have done incredibly well considering the unprecedented circumstances of the last year - thanks to the amazing faithfulness an generosity of you all. Thanks also to generous levy reductions from the Archdiocese we have even been able to invest in the technology that has allowed us to keep in touch through the live-streaming of our Masses and services and in some maintenance of the church. 

# Maze Puzzle




