

During Lent on Mondays, Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament before Mass from 9.30 to 10.00 am and also the Stations of the Cross after Mass.

On Wednesdays there will be Exposition from 9.30 am until Mass at 10.00 with a further period of Exposition after Mass until Benediction at 12 noon

On Thursdays there will be Exposition from 6.00 pm to 6.45 pm, during which the Sacrament of Confession is available in the meeting room. The Novena to Our Lady of Perpetual Succour is at 6.45 pm with Mass at 7.00 pm

Remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass was reinstated on the First Sunday of Lent (6th March)

SCIAF EMERGENCY UKRAINE APPEAL

As we watch the heart-breaking scenes from the Ukraine, SCIAF has launched an emergency appeal. SCIAF is a member of Caritas Internationalis, the global network of Catholic Relief agencies, which is leading a global response to the conflict. Caritas Ukraine is supporting people displaced by the conflict within the country, while Caritas Poland, Caritas Moldova and Caritas Romania are supporting refugees who have fled to find safety in neighbouring countries. Later that same evening of 25th March. Archbishop Nolan will lead the Rosarv in George Square at 6.30 pm - you are invited to gather there and 'storm heaven' with prayers for peace.

He said to the man who looked after the vineyard, "Look here, for three years now I have been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and finding none. Cut it down: why should it be taking up the ground?" "Sir." the man replied "leave it one more year and give me time to dig round it and manure it: it may bear fruit next year; if not, then you can cut it down."

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


