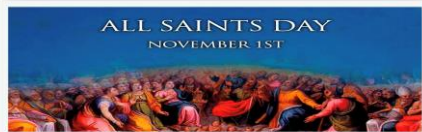

ANNUAL INSURANCE COSTS: Dear parishioners, this is the time of the year when we appeal to you once again try to give a little extra in the offertory collection towards our annual insurance bill which is **£6,377.23** and is due at the end of the month. Thank you so much for your help.



1st November is the Solemnity of All Saints, a holyday of Obligation. To allow an extra opportunity to attend Mass, there will be two **Masses on All Saints Day at 10.00am and 7.00pm**



2nd November is the commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, also known as All Souls Day, a day set aside for us to pray for our family and friends who have died. All Souls Day shifts the Church's focus on praying for the Faithful Departed throughout November. The celebration of Mass is the highest means the Church

provides for praying for the dead. A *plenary indulgence*, is granted to the faithful who on All Souls' Day, devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed. **There will be two Masses on All Souls Day at 10.00 am and 7.00 pm.** Fr. Benneth's prayer intention at the 7.00pm Mass is for all those parishioners, family and friends of ours, who died in the course of the last year. Their names will be read out at mass. Please give their names to Fr. Benneth. **Tea and coffee will be served in the hall after mass.**



THE SACRAMENTS: Please contact Fr. Benneth if,

1. You need your child to be baptised; you are a baptised catholic who has not yet received the Sacrament of Confirmation; or you want to become a catholic, and need to be part of our RCIA course.
2. Your Child attends a Catholic school, or a non-Denominational school, and is due for their First Confession, First Communion, and Confirmation.
3. You know of any housebound parishioner who needs the Sacrament of the Sick, or who simply needs a visit from a priest.
4. You want to receive the Sacrament of Matrimony; or you want to be a priest.

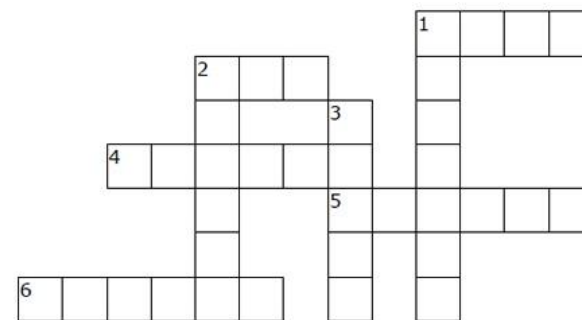

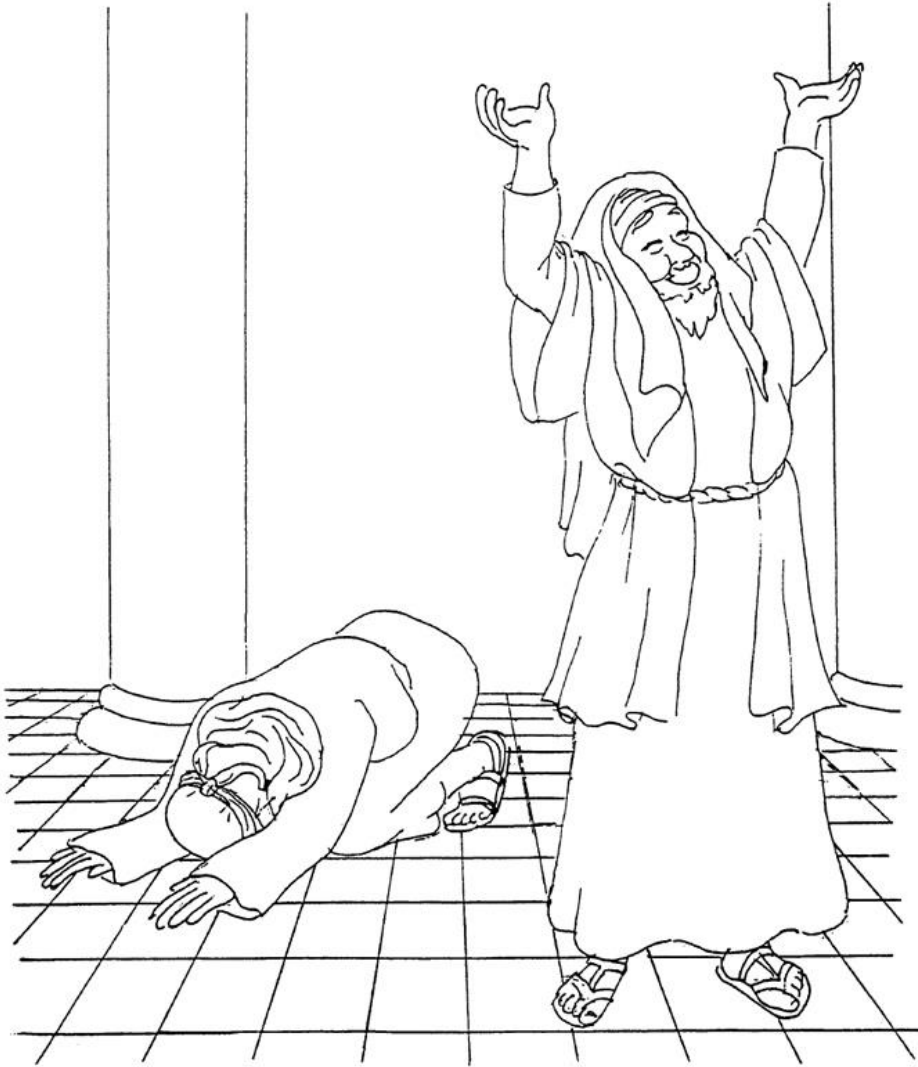
