ARCHDIOCESE OF GLASGOW: NEW PASTORAL AREAS:

Following the pastoral plan of Archbishop William Nolan to restructure the Archdiocese of Glasgow for future evangelisation, a list of new pastoral areas has been provisionally agreed (A pastoral area is made up of a small number of parishes working together as a cluster). The following are the names of parishes in our pastoral area; St. Helen's Langside, Holy Cross Crosshill, St. Bridget's Toryglen, and Bl. Dun Scotus. The parish priests and representatives of these parishes have been asked to meet and answer the following questions.

Where are the opportunities for evangelization?

- Are there some initiatives on evangelization that could be taken forward very soon?
- What would a revised Mass Schedule look like in your Pastoral Area?
- Where might your Pastoral Area increase collaboration?
- What might we do better if we collaborated more closely?
- What is your vision for Collaboration and evangelization?
- Are there practical steps you might consider that might bring this about?

Report on this discussion should be sent to the Steering Group in the Archdiocese by 9th October.
