

DECREE OF ERECTION OF ST AMBROSE PARISH

The exalted office of Bishop and Chief Shepherd of souls in the diocese of Lansing, committed to Us by Holiness Pope Pius of blessed memory, the visible representative of Jesus Christ on earth, enjoins upon Us the duty of providing the best possible manner for the salvation of souls by the establishment of new parishes in the Diocese as conditions warrant and demand, according to the Sacred Canons of the Code.

After a careful study of the needs of the Catholics in Parchment and having consulted those who have interest in the establishment of a new parish in that territory, We by these present hereby erect according to the sacred law of the Church a new parish, to be known as the Parish of St Ambrose, the pastor of which is not irremovable, and the territory of which is to be determined later at a meeting of the pastors of the adjacent parishes, subject to the approval of the Bishop of the Diocese.

Given at Lansing, Michigan, on this Feast of SS Peter and Paul, this 29th day of June, 1955.

SOLEMN FEAST OF SS. PETER AND PAUL,

6/29/2025

Dear Beloved Parishioners,

Between the two of them, Peter and Paul, we know more about the "acts" of

Paul compared to Peter's. About both of them we know that they were each challenged by Jesus to take a leadership role in the project of forming the Church, the assembly of all who believe in Jesus.

Peter was a fisherman, a commercial fisherman. He pretty well knew the lake that was his fish-garden. More than once Jesus gave him advice that led to whopping catches of fish. The first of these events overwhelmed Peter with a sense that he was out of place even just being with Jesus.

But the encouraging grace of Jesus' call carried Peter beyond his knee-jerk response to Jesus' holiness ("Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man."-Luke 5:8) to where Peter could, without hesitation, make his well-known profession of faith ("You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."—Matthew 16:16) Brash, unfiltered, Peter said things he would come to regret ("Woman, I do not know him."-Luke 22:57). And he was not out of Jesus' reconciling reach.

Paul, who never met Jesus during his mortal life, was a deep believer in the Law of Moses, the necessity of following it strictly. And he viewed those who were equally sure of their faith in Jesus as a danger to the prevailing faith of the Jewish people. And so he went to extremes in persecuting men and women, believers in the Way of Jesus.

The wonderful/dreadful event of Paul's encounter with the risen Lord as Paul was on his way to round up some of these heretics is recounted three times in the Acts of the Apostles (chapters 9, 22 and 26). And the many letters of Paul to churches he founded or hoped to visit give us a gold mine of the earliest, the ground-breaking reflection on the life and teaching of Jesus for which Paul is well -known.

We celebrate these two GIANTS of apostleship annually on June 29. When 6/29 falls on Sunday, we all get to celebrate together the grace of God at work in two very different men for the good of the Church and the promotion of the reign of God.

Saints Peter and Paul, pray for us.







St. Augustine Cathedral School Introduces New Logo

Following nearly two years of development, St. Augustine Cathedral School has unveiled a new logo.

Beginning in fall 2023, a committee of staff, students, and families began a two-phase study that started with a general evaluation of the school's branding, followed by a more focused look at the school's visual image, facilitated by the Catholic consulting firm *Partners in Mission*.

"As we worked through the first phase of the study, we recommitted that the school's mission statement remains relevant to the work we do," says Dr. Andra Zommers, Principal. "But as we considered the visuals, the committee found opportunities to update our branding in ways that would speak better to who we are with symbols unique to our school's patron, St. Augustine, while also aligning more closely with that of Hackett Catholic Prep and St. Monica Catholic School.

"One of the highlights of the process was asking our students to demonstrate our mission and values in a drawing. And then following presentations to leadership groups and our parent community, our oldest students shared the logo with their families as our 'final' approval."

The logo was officially adopted in May, and it will be phased in over time.

"Our 'brand' is the perception and feeling associated with St. Augustine Cathedral School. It is both factual and emotional. It is our outward sign to the community of who we aspire to be within our school," said Zommers.
