In the Gospel of Matthew, as the Lord Jesus was about to ascend to the Father, He gave the Great Commission to the Apostles, commanding them to "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.\* And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Mt. 28:19-20). Jesus established the Catholic Church to evangelize, and He gives us His Great Commission in Matthew's gospel to make disciples of all nations, to baptize them, to teach all He commands us, and to trust that He is with us always. The reason we exist as a Church is to evangelize. To evangelize is to welcome people into a personal relationship with God that will transform them completely inside and out. Living out the Great Commission of Jesus is both personal and communal. Each of us is called personally not only to witness to our faith but also to accompany others in faith. Each of our parishes, schools, and ministries have the same mission, and it should be fostered each time the community comes together.

**Catholic Charities of South Mississippi** provides a multitude of life-affirming services to those in our community experiencing stress and hardship. Services include:

- Food Bank -- distributes food and other goods to local food pantries and soup kitchens
- Community Outreach Offices located in Hattiesburg, Gulfport, Pascagoula and Waveland. Provides many services to assist individuals in need, including:
  - o Pregnancy testing and options counseling
  - o Case management
  - o Financial assistance
  - o Budgeting education and goal setting
  - o Food distribution
  - o Infant care items such as carseats, cribs, diapers, clothing, etc.
- Disaster Relief and Recovery -- assists those affected by natural or manmade disasters to return home again
- Representative Payee Program -- money management for those receiving SSA, SSI, or SSDI who have been deemed by Social Security as needing help
- Language Translations
- Social Service Coordination for Seniors -provides services to residents of Catholic Charities Housing Associations properties
- Adoptions -- provides services to those looking to adopt or looking to place a child for adoption. Home study services, postplacement services, and birth parent services are available.
- Counseling -- provides individual, marriage, and family counseling. Services are available to people of all ages. Group counseling sessions are also available. Services are provided on a sliding fee scale and most insurances are accepted.

The Catholic Diocese of Biloxi is proud to have Loaves and Fishes serving meals to

those facing hunger at the former Mercy Cross High School property. This is the first of many phases that will happen over the next year to open a permanent day shelter for the unhoused on the property. The Diocese of Biloxi and Catholic Charities of South Mississippi understand the need for great partners, such as Loaves & Fishes and the City of Biloxi, in order to best serve the community. The day shelter project is moving forward and more details will be announced in the new year.



de l'Epée provides spiritual

well-being, promotion of independence and

inclusion in the community for the deaf, hard of hearing and disabled. Through communication and understanding we promote the Gospel teachings to follow in our Lord's footsteps. Only through accurate communication and understanding of culture can people with disabilities be included in all aspects of life and further their desire to become Intentional Disciples.

Recently, de l'Epée has expanded its services to include ministry to the disabled and all of God's children with special needs through The Tabitha Project. This ministry is named for a faithful Christian woman named Dorcas (or Tabitha, in Aramaic) who spent her life in service towards those who were less fortunate. Tabitha was committed to good works and game alms to the poor continually.

Peter was called from Lydda (17 miles away), when Tabitha became ill and died. Upon his arrival, Peter knelt down and prayed, then turning to the body he said,

"Tabitha, arise." Tabitha opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter, she sat up. It became known throughout all Joppa, and many believed in the Lord.



The Tabitha Project

logo reflects the mission of the ministry. The needle and thread mending hearts reminds us of our namesake's passion to serve. The antlers give us a subtle reminder that Tabitha translates to gazelle,

appreciated for its beauty and grace. The red text symbolizes the blood that reminds us, we are all equal children of God. The word project tells us that this is not an original thought, but rather the continuation of the good works and acts of mercy that Tabitha herself gave to those around her.

biloxi.smugmug.com, which includes a vast archive of Bishop Kihneman's homilies. In October, the office launched GulfPineCatholic.com, a new and exciting way to get diocesan news, photos and events. Visitors to the website can access an online version of the Gulf Pine Catholic newspaper and sign up for regular email updates.

The family is the domestic Church and the primary place of formation of values, consciences and discipleship in the Lord Jesus. The Office of Marriage & Family Life Ministries works to affirm, support, and strengthen all facets of family life by providing programs for spiritual enrichment, healing, and renewal so that each person in the family can draw closer to Christ and move deeper into discipleship with Him.

Every relationship needs attention and care to thrive, and marriage is no different. Couples sometimes run on autopilot for months or even years, caught up in the daily tasks of creating a home together, working, caring for children, and serving others.

There are a million and one ways to nurture your relationship: intentional coupletime, learning more about your mission as a married couple, growing in communication skills, etc. No effort is wasted; your love is worth investing in! We can help you on your journey.

This office sponsors a healing ministry called **Rachel's Vineyard**. It is a ministry that provides healing and forgiveness for women who have had abortions, and also for women and men who have suffered from abortion. **Rachel's Vineyard** is a three-day retreat facilitated by both laypeople and clergy. The team also includes a mental-health professional to help monitor and guide the participants as they deal with a number of emotions and feelings. The participants of this wonderful weekend are able to experience the true healing touch of Jesus.

Another exciting project that has recently launched by **The Office of Marriage & Family Life Ministries** is *Walking with Moms in Need*. Walking with Moms in Need is a process through which Catholic parishes and communities "walk in the shoes" of local

pregnant and parenting women in need.

Pregnant and parenting moms in need are in our parishes and our neighborhoods. As Pope Francis reminds us, our parishes need to be "islands of mercy in the midst of a sea of indifference." Everyone in the parish community should know where to refer a pregnant woman in need.

The 25th anniversary of *Evangelium vitae* gave us a wonderful opportunity to begin to assess, expand, and communicate resources to pregnant moms and families in need. Parishes are invited, through the support of their bishop and pastor, to join this nationwide effort entitled *Walking with Moms in Need*.

The Pro-Life Billboard Initiative and Tags for Life are also ways that this office is promoting the Pro-Life message.



The **Office of Evangelization** promotes the Church's call to Evangelization by providing vision and formation for leaders; coordinating diocesan evangelization initiatives, and helping parishes explore creative new ways for deepening, re-awakening, and sharing of our Catholic Faith.

The **Office of Evangelization** offers *Ananias* workshops designed to accompany others on their faith journey. It also offers *Called and Gifted* **training through the** *Catherine of Siena Institute*. This office also offers evangelization workshops for parishes and schools and families based on *Missio Nostra: Our Mission -- Living out the Great Commission of Jesus Christ*.

After conducting the Rescue Project for priests, deacons and diocesan staff, the **Office of Evangelization** is now doing the same for parishes throughout the diocese.



The Rescue Project is a multi-week video experience of the Gospel and is designed to be offered in a small group format everywhere and anywhere. Sponsored by Acts 29, it flows from the conviction that the most urgent task in the Church is a compelling and attractive proclamation of the Gospel. It's aim is threefold: that people might be 1) overwhelmed by the good news of what God has done for us, 2) moved to surrender their lives to Jesus in faith, and, 3) mobilized for mission.

Our vision for *Pathways to Discipleship* allows our parishes to evangelize and disciple from Pre- Evangelization through Disciple maker. Our hope is to allow an encounter with Jesus to occur and hearts to be moved in accompanying other in their walk with Christ.

The Office of the Diaconate has teamed with the Office of Evangelization and the Core Team of Forming Intentional Disciples in presenting Intentional Discipleship workshops to the Deacons of the Diocese of Biloxi.
