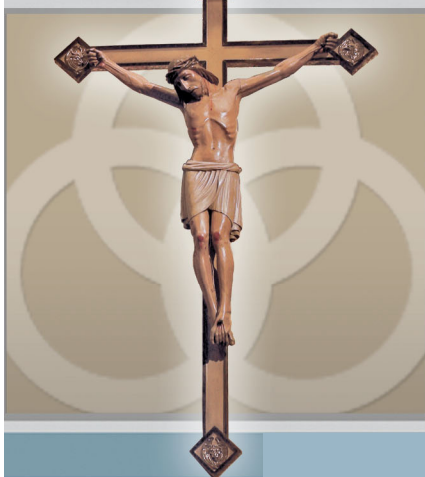

A Message from Fr. Kevin Nolan...

Dear Parishioners,

On the day of my ordination, I was asked to make three promises... poverty, chastity and obedience. Just recently, I was told to suspend public Masses to help circumvent the spread of COVID-19.

I listened to the directive from our Archbishop but wondered how to get around it? "We need spiritual nourishment now more than ever... People have a right to practice their faith... How can I let people know when I would be celebrating my daily private Mass and they could just 'slip in'."

It takes humility to admit we don't know everything. Our top public health experts in union with the California Bishops have asked us to avoid gatherings of more than ten people. I'm trying to adapt and learn the process of live streaming the Mass. Through the prayers of the Mass and our spiritual communion, may God heal the broken parts of our life so that we can more effectively love our neighbor as God needs us to.

Love means, "willing the good for the other". In the midst of this pandemic, we work for the good of our neighbors by being obedient. Let's embrace the cross that comes from social distancing and flatten the curve to end this crisis. True sacrifice is about doing what God asks us to do for Him and our neighbor.

Letter from Archbishop José H. Gomez

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Please know of my prayers for you in these days of anxiety and uncertainty.

It is true that with the worldwide outbreak of the coronavirus, we are facing a global health emergency that is like nothing we have seen in our lifetimes. But our hope is in the Lord and we know that he will give us his grace and mercy in our time of need.

We need to approach this emergency with faith and confidence in God and also with prudence.

As we know, the virus is spreading here in Los Angeles, throughout the United States, and in many other countries. Doctors, public health officials, and civil authorities are still trying to determine the scope of the emergency and come up with appropriate measures for treating the illness and containing the outbreak.

We also know that this virus is contagious and is spread person-to-person. It can be gravely dangerous for certain vulnerable members of our community, including the elderly and those with existing health issues. Already this illness has killed several thousand people worldwide.

Given the dangers and uncertainties, after prayer and reflection, and in consultation with my brother bishops and priests and lay advisors, I have authorized certain precautions and accommodations related to the celebration of the Eucharist in our parishes. These measures are intended to lessen the risk that we will endanger our people or spread this illness during our worship.

I urge you to review these measures (see page 3). We have also established a page on our website, lacatholics.org/emergency to provide resources and updates on the coronavirus as it relates to our parishes, schools, and ministries. To receive updates, you can register online at <https://archla.flocknote.com/ADLAUpdates>, or you can text "ADLA" to "84576." The celebration of the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith. But it is important to remember that our obligation to participate in the Mass is dispensed for grave causes.

Therefore, in this grave and extraordinary moment, I am dispensing all the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and all Catholics currently in the Archdiocese from the obligation of attending Sunday Masses.

I encourage those of you to stay home and read the Gospels, pray with your families, and to join yourself to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion. There are a number of prayers of spiritual communion that you can use, the one I like is simple: "I wish, my Lord, to receive you with the purity, humility, and devotion with which your most holy mother received you, with the spirit and fervor of the saints."

I also encourage you to participate in the Holy Mass via the Internet. A livestream of the Mass is broadcast from the Cathedral of Our Lady of Angels each Sunday. You can watch live on the LA Catholics Facebook Page (facebook.com/lacatholics/) or visit lacatholics.org/emergency/. The English Mass is celebrated at 10 a.m. and the Spanish Mass is celebrated at 12:30 p.m. There are also several other parishes in the Archdiocese that provide livestreams of their Masses over the Internet or social media. You can find a listing of those and links to their livestreams at lacatholics.org/emergency/. We are also arranging to have daily Mass livestreamed, as well; please check our website for updates.

In addition, we have been advised by California public health authorities to limit our gatherings to not more than 10 people. This health emergency is developing rapidly, and it may be necessary to take more restrictive measures in the near future. Archdiocesan officials will continue to monitor and study the latest guidance that is being provided by the Centers for Disease Control, local public health officials, and our civic leaders.

For now, I urge your prayers and vigilance in doing whatever you can to protect the public health and to keep our families and neighbors safe from harm.

Let us pray for those who are sick and those who have lost loved ones already to this virus. May God console them and grant them peace. Let us also pray for doctors, nurses, and caregivers, for public health officials and all civic leaders. May God grant them courage and prudence as they seek to respond to this emergency with compassion and in service to the common good. In this time of trial, I entrust us all to the maternal care and intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe. I invite you to join me in praying the prayer below, which is composed especially for this moment.

May God be gracious to us, and make his face shine upon us.

And may he grant us peace,

ARCHDIOCESE ANNOUNCES SUSPENSION OF MASSES AMID COVID-19 PANDEMIC

March 16, 2020

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles announced this afternoon the suspension of Masses amid the current health threat due to COVID-19 (novel coronavirus).

“I deeply regret that we are forced to temporarily suspend public celebration of the Mass in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles,” said Archbishop José H. Gomez. “What we do in the Church, we do out of love for God and love for our brothers and sisters. We are taking this extraordinary step today out of love and concern for those in our families and communities who are most vulnerable to this deadly coronavirus.”

Archbishop Gomez stressed that the decision was “not made lightly,” and that it was made after “much prayer and reflection” and in consultation with the Archdiocese’s auxiliary bishops, Council of Priests, lay advisors, and government and public health officials.

“I ask your continued prayers for all those who are afflicted with this virus and those who are afraid and vulnerable. I also ask you to pray and reach out to help the many families who are facing difficulties as a result of this emergency. We also need to keep in our prayers all the doctors, nurses, caregivers, and public health and civil authorities working to contain the outbreak of this virus and treat those who are sick,” stated the Archbishop.

Catholics are encouraged to continue to pray at home with their families and join to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion. They are also encouraged to participate in the Holy Mass via the Internet. The Archdiocese will provide a livestream of non-public Masses from the Cathedral of Our Lady of Angels daily and on Sunday via Facebook, @lacatholics, (facebook.com/lacatholics/) or visit lacatholics.org/emergency/. The daily Mass (M-F) in English at 12:10 p.m. and the Sunday Masses in English at 10 a.m. and in Spanish at 12:30 p.m. will be livestreamed.

**LA ARQUIDIÓCESIS ANUNCIA SUSPENSIÓN DE MISAS DEBIDO
A LA PANDEMIA DEL COVID-19
16 de marzo del 2020**

La Arquidiócesis de Los Ángeles anunció esta tarde la suspensión de las Misas en vista de la actual amenaza de salud debido al COVID-19 (coronavirus).

“Lamento profundamente que nos veamos forzados a suspender temporalmente la celebración pública de la Misa en la Arquidiócesis de Los Ángeles”, dijo el Arzobispo José H. Gomez. “Lo que hacemos en la Iglesia, lo hacemos por el amor a Dios y por el amor hacia nuestros hermanos y hermanas. Hoy estamos tomando este paso extraordinario por el amor y la preocupación por aquellos que en nuestras familias y comunidades son los más vulnerables ante este mortal coronavirus”.

El Arzobispo Gomez reiteró que la decisión no “fue hecha a la ligera”, y que fue tomada después de “muchas oración y reflexión” y después de consulta con los obispos auxiliares de la Arquidiócesis, con el Consejo de Sacerdotes, con asesores laicos, y con funcionarios gubernamentales y de salud pública.

“Les pido sus oraciones continuas para todos aquellos que están afectados por este virus, por quienes tienen temor y por los más vulnerables. Además, les pido que oren y se acerquen a ayudar a las familias que están enfrentando dificultades como resultado de esta emergencia. También necesitamos mantener en nuestras oraciones a todos los médicos, enfermeras, cuidadores, y a las autoridades civiles y de salud pública que están trabajando para contener el brote de este virus y están tratando a quienes están enfermos”, declaró el Arzobispo.

Se anima a los católicos a continuar orando en casa con sus familias y a unirse en el sacrificio de la Misa haciendo un acto de comunión espiritual. También se les anima a participar en la Santa Misa vía Internet. La Arquidiócesis hará transmisiones en vivo de Misas no públicas celebradas en la Catedral de Nuestra Señora de Los Ángeles a diario y el domingo, vía Facebook, @lacatholics, ([facebook.com/lacatholics/](https://www.facebook.com/lacatholics/)) o visitando lacatholics.org/emergency/. Se harán transmisiones en vivo de la Misa diaria (lunes a viernes) en inglés a las 12:10 p.m. y de las Misas de los domingos, en inglés a las 10 a.m. y en español a las 12:30 p.m.

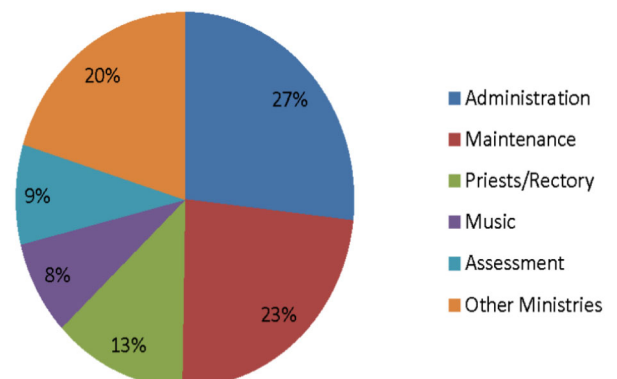

Early abuse identification is key

We can do our best to ensure that the children in our community are as safe as possible, and one critical way is to take immediate action at the first hint of improper behavior by an adult towards a child. Be familiar with ways in which perpetrators attempt to groom children, their parents, and church communities so that you can recognize and interrupt such behaviors promptly. Paying attention to changes in behavior, appetite, or demeanor in the children we know is also important as these cues may be reflective of a child's distress. "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die."

—John 11:25-26

Scripture Focus:

Today's readings marvel at the creative, life-giving power of God. Ezekiel tells us that the God who can transform lifeless bones into vital human beings can restore a nation from the death of exile to a life of freedom. In the Gospel we see a marvelously dramatic example of the power of God to bring life out of death. Jesus is deeply moved by the death of a friend, but makes it clear to the disciples that in "untying" Lazarus he is talking about more than physical death. He is calling us to see and believe in God's life-giving power to help us in our daily "deaths". Resurrection is not something that comes only after death but is already part of this life for us who believe.

Reflection:

1. "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God...". How has God's glory been manifested in times of illness or death in your life?
2. Jesus said "Untie him and let him go". What needs to be "untied" in your life to help you live more freely?
3. What are some "resurrection" moments you have experienced that remind you of God's life-giving presence in our world?
4. In a world that fosters death (war, violence, abortion, death penalty...) what can we do to promote life?
