Dear Parishioners,

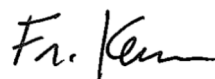
In light of recent events and the Safer at Home edict the Archdiocese stated:

Therefore, parish churches, chapels, centers, and missions are to be closed to the public effective March 24, 2020 until April 19, 2020 (inclusive) or until further notice.

Letter from Archbishop José H. Gomez

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Please know of my prayers for you in these days of anxiety and uncertainty.

It is true that with the worldwide outbreak of the coronavirus, we are facing a global health emergency that is like nothing we have seen in our lifetimes. But our hope is in the Lord and we know that he will give us his grace and mercy in our time of need.

We need to approach this emergency with faith and confidence in God and also with prudence.

As we know, the virus is spreading here in Los Angeles, throughout the United States, and in many other countries. Doctors, public health officials, and civil authorities are still trying to determine the scope of the emergency and come up with appropriate measures for treating the illness and containing the outbreak.

We also know that this virus is contagious and is spread person-to-person. It can be gravely dangerous for certain vulnerable members of our community, including the elderly and those with existing health issues. Already this illness has killed several thousand people worldwide.

Given the dangers and uncertainties, after prayer and reflection, and in consultation with my brother bishops and priests and lay advisors, I have authorized certain precautions and accommodations related to the celebration of the Eucharist in our parishes. These measures are intended to lessen the risk that we will endanger our people or spread this illness during our worship.

I urge you to review these measures (see page 3). We have also established a page on our website, lacatholics.org/emergency to provide resources and updates on the coronavirus as it relates to our parishes, schools, and ministries. To receive updates, you can register online at <https://archla.flocknote.com/ADLAUpdates>, or you can text "ADLA" to "84576." The celebration of the Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith. But it is important to remember that our obligation to participate in the Mass is dispensed for grave causes.

Therefore, in this grave and extraordinary moment, I am dispensing all the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and all Catholics currently in the Archdiocese from the obligation of attending Sunday Masses.

I encourage those of you to stay home and read the Gospels, pray with your families, and to join yourself to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an act of spiritual communion. There are a number of prayers of spiritual communion that you can use, the one I like is simple: "I wish, my Lord, to receive you with the purity, humility, and devotion with which your most holy mother received you, with the spirit and fervor of the saints."

I also encourage you to participate in the Holy Mass via the Internet. A livestream of the Mass is broadcast from the Cathedral of Our Lady of Angels each Sunday. You can watch live on the LA Catholics Facebook Page (facebook.com/lacatholics/) or visit lacatholics.org/emergency/. The English Mass is celebrated at 10 a.m. and the Spanish Mass is celebrated at 12:30 p.m. There are also several other parishes in the Archdiocese that provide livestreams of their Masses over the Internet or social media. You can find a listing of those and links to their livestreams at lacatholics.org/emergency/. We are also arranging to have daily Mass livestreamed, as well; please check our website for updates.

In addition, we have been advised by California public health authorities to limit our gatherings to not more than 10 people. This health emergency is developing rapidly, and it may be necessary to take more restrictive measures in the near future. Archdiocesan officials will continue to monitor and study the latest guidance that is being provided by the Centers for Disease Control, local public health officials, and our civic leaders.

For now, I urge your prayers and vigilance in doing whatever you can to protect the public health and to keep our families and neighbors safe from harm.

Let us pray for those who are sick and those who have lost loved ones already to this virus. May God console them and grant them peace. Let us also pray for doctors, nurses, and caregivers, for public health officials and all civic leaders. May God grant them courage and prudence as they seek to respond to this emergency with compassion and in service to the common good. In this time of trial, I entrust us all to the maternal care and intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe. I invite you to join me in praying the prayer below, which is composed especially for this moment.

May God be gracious to us, and make his face shine upon us.

And may he grant us peace,

Confessions

Our regularly scheduled confessions in the church have been suspended until the Safer at Home edict is lifted. The priest can offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation but only if in danger of death or extremely extraordinary situations. If this is the case, please call the parish office (310-548-6535, ext. 300) whereby arrangements will be made. (There are no confessions by phone, electronic means, or by “drive-up”).

Remember: you can always confess directly to God with a sincere Act of Contrition and be fully in His grace. At a later time, when able, you can celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation.

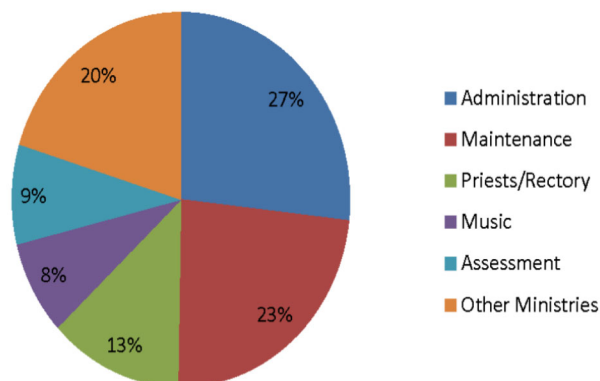

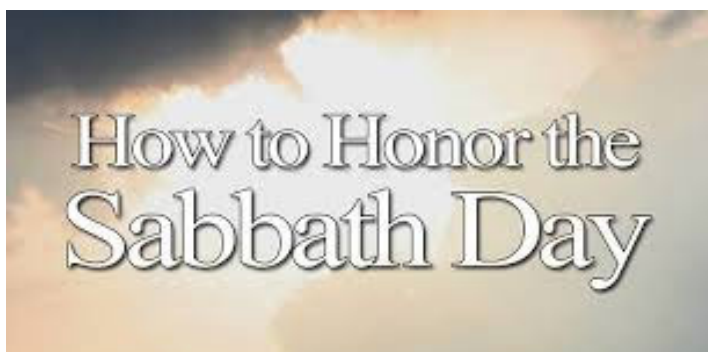

Signs of abuse in children

Last week we discussed the importance of early identification in stopping abuse. This week, we're looking at some of the signs of abuse that could help adults recognize whether children are in danger. These signs could include withdrawal from others, or a general mistrust of adults. A child who is being sexually abused may relate to others in a sexualized way, inappropriate for his or her age. He or she may suddenly refuse to go to school, or become very fearful of school, or the dark. Other signs that could indicate a child is being sexually abused include aggressive or secretive behavior. Keeping an eye out for these things can help an adult ask the right questions while serving as a trusted source of support and love for a child in need. Otras señales que pueden indicar que un niño/a está siendo abusado/a incluye agresividad o conducta secreta. Estar pendiente de estas señales puede ayudar a un adulto a hacer las preguntas correctas cuando sirve como una fuente de confianza y de amor de un/a niño/a necesitado/a. Scripture Focus:

The crowds demand that Jesus "be crucified." In this, they side with religious leaders. Two of Jesus' chosen disciples also side with values opposed to the authorities; Peter, who was first among the apostles and first to confess Jesus as the Son of the Living God, now denies that same Jesus out of fear for his own life. Jesus, the obedient Son, deliberately chooses to be faithful to God's values even though it led to his death. He dies, as he lived, carrying out God's will.

Reflection:

1. Are there times when your busyness, fears, or false values have prevented you from responding to a person who needed you? Give examples.
2. Share a time when you were faithful to your Christian values instead of going along with the crowd. What issues in society today threaten our Christian values?
3. Plotters, fickle admirers, cowardly disciples, faithful women, all play a role in the passion narrative. What role do I play? What role do I want to play?

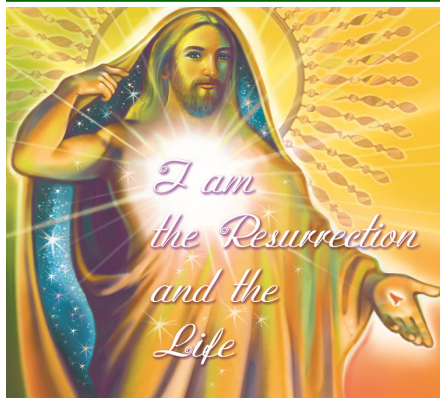

3. It is good to **read the New Testament** starting with the Gospel of Matthew through Revelation during this time. Just read 15 to 20 minutes a day. The Laudate app has the entire bible on it.
