Today's Reflection: Audacity

There is a spirit of audacity in our readings today. During a time of injustice and threat of invasion, the prophet Micah boldly announces that the God of insignificant Israel will raise up a leader from backwater Bethlehem, and this leader will bring justice and peace to the whole world. In the Gospel, Elizabeth and Mary, marginalized women, brazenly celebrate that their sons will be world-changing instruments of God. We further learn that this audacity is rooted in trust in God. The author of Hebrews describes the faithful obedience of Jesus. Mary is shown as the exemplar of faithful trust in God. This is the way God often seems to work, in the ordinary and marginalized in our world. Those who seem weak have learned to trust in God's strength. These have the audacity to become instruments of God's peace and justice.

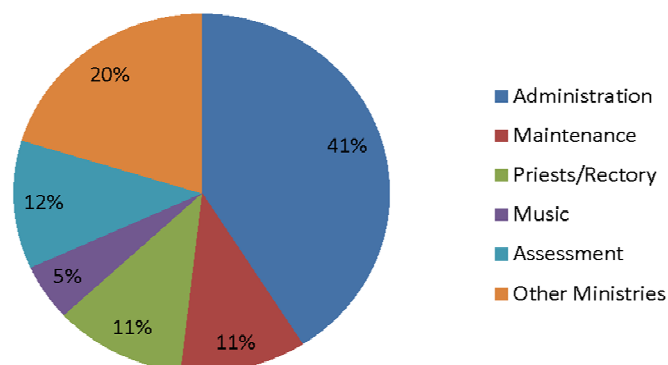

Some Filipino liturgical music will be sung by the Filipino Choir of Domingo T de Guzman, Jr. with the assistance of our parish accompanist, Melinda West, who is of Filipino descent.

Fire safety: Close before you doze

If there is a fire in your home, there is a 900-degree difference between a closed door and an open one. Firefighters recommend that you always close doors before you and your children go to sleep. Remembering the simple phrase “Close before you doze” can help prevent toxic gasses and flames from getting in your room, giving firefighters more time to rescue you. Closing your children’s doors before bed is a quick, easy step to keep them safe — and provides an extra layer of security when coupled with working smoke alarms and a family safety plan. Scripture Focus:

Children never tire of hearing the same stories over and over. As adults we hear the story of Christmas over and over but each year it is different because, hopefully, we are different. As a family in faith we are called to be a Holy Family. Scripture suggests that Jesus lived a very normal family life. They observed the Jewish rituals and even had their family tensions. On one occasion Jesus stayed on in the temple after his parents had left. When the distraught parents found him he told them he had to do what God asked. He then went home with them and continued to grow in wisdom, age and grace. We are called to do the same: to do God’s will and to make every effort to grow in our relationship with Him.

Reflection:

1. Remember your Christmas celebrations as a child. What are your happiest memories?
2. What opportunities are you taking to grow in wisdom, age and grace?
3. Every family is a “holy family.” In your family situation, what can you do to better affirm the goodness in each member?

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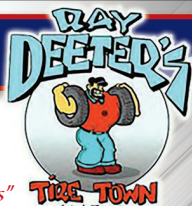
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
