



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In the backyard of the house where I live with other priests, there is a lemon tree which produces a huge amount of fruit. One evening in the spring I needed some lemons for a chicken dish. I glanced from the kitchen and saw the tree bursting with large, bright, gorgeous lemons, hanging thick on seemingly every branch. Turning to Fr. Bob (I'll change his name to protect the innocent) who sat on the couch, I said, "Father, could you pick a few lemons for me?" He said sure and into the backyard he went. He returned a few minutes later emptyhanded. "John, there's no lemons. Sorry." I said, "What are you talking about?" I looked again and saw the grapefruit tree on the other side of the yard, which had recently been picked clean of fruit. He didn't see the abundant fruit because he was looking in the wrong place!

Like Fr. Bob, we sadly don't see the fruit all around us. We think that the culture is spiraling down, young people avoid church, and the future looks bleak. Why go out into the world and work? The world looks like a fruitless tree.

Jesus doesn't see things that way. This week he tells us, "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few." Look again: there is spiritual fruit hanging all around us! The lonely ready to be visited. The sick ready to be healed. The forgotten ready to be remembered. The poor ready to be treated with dignity. The sad ready to be consoled. The young ready for the Gospel. So, let's ask the Lord to send laborers to get to work. And he will. He might send you and me. Just remember to look at the correct trees. - Father John Muir



The Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius: Retreat in Daily Life

at Holy Trinity!

What are the Spiritual Exercises?

The Spiritual Exercises are meditations developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola out of his prayer experiences primarily with Scripture. Through these means, the heart is opened to be touched personally and directly by God. As a result of such encounters with God, one experiences deeply God's profound and complete love for them and learns to recognize the Spirit's movements within. This is the basis for discernment.

Who is this for?

The Exercises are for anyone who desires a deeper relationship with God through Jesus. Those discerning vocations, faced with a major decision or in the midst of a life transition are often drawn to the Exercises.

What can I expect? Your journey through the Exercises will require:

- . A prayer commitment of 45-60 minutes each day, plus about 15 minutes for journaling
- · Fifteen minutes of reflective prayer (called the Examen) each evening,
- A weekly, 1-hour meeting with your Exercises facilitator (Online sessions available.)
- Participation in an orientation, monthly faith sharing conferences, and a closing retreat which will take
 place on the following dates at Holy Trinity (exact locations TBA):

September 9, 2023: Orientation Retreat (10 am - 4 pm)

September 30, 2023: Faith Sharing Conference 1 (10 am—12 noon)

October 21, 2023: Faith Sharing Conference 2 (10 am—12 noon)

November 18, 2023: Faith Sharing Conference 3 (10 am—12 noon)

December 16, 2023: Faith Sharing Conference 4 (10 am—12 noon)

January 6, 2024: Faith Sharing Conference 5 (10 am—12 noon)

January 27, 2024: Faith Sharing Conference 6 (10 am—12 noon)

February 17, 2024: Faith Sharing Conference 7 (10 am—12 noon)

March 16, 2024: Faith Sharing Conference 8 (10 am—12 noon)

April 27, 2024: Faith Sharing Conference 9 (10 am—12 noon)

June 1, 2024: Closing Retreat (9 am - 12 pm)



Is there a fee:

Yes, the fee to cover materials and other costs for the year is \$300 or \$30/month. However, you are welcome to offer whatever you are able for your retreat.

About your facilitator... Tammy Ezzi has a Master's in Theology with an emphasis in Christian Formation and Discipleship and a Doctorate in Clinical Psychology from Fuller Theological Seminary. She married Justin (music minister at the 8:30 am Mass) in 1999 and completed her Sacraments in 2001, both at Holy Trinity. She earned her certificate in Ignatian Spirituality from Loyola Institute for Spirituality in 2004 under Fr. 




