Pastor's Note " News from Nolan"

Dear Parishioners,

The following is an excerpt from "The Challenge of the Gospel" by Rev. Joseph Slattery.

Where gospel and cultural values are concerned, do we have a foot in both camps?

Imagine a man who goes to a movie one evening, and, in the middle of the movie, he becomes aware that he has left his car keys in the ignition and the door unlocked.

He wondered if he should go out and get them right now, or wait until the end of the movie.

He decides not to leave, but for the remainder of the film, his mind is half – present to the movie and half present to his car.

He is divided.

That's a good image of how many people actually are today – they have one foot in the church and one foot in a different world.

They are divided between running with the culture of the day and giving some acknowledgement to the gospel.

Jesus must have encountered such conflicted people in his day too, and, in this Sunday's gospel, he uses a striking image to communicate it – the image of the elder and younger son.

The key to understanding the story may be found in the conversion of the **younger son**. He had started out by making a clear choice to reject his father's wishes.

The consequences were also clear to him – a damaged relationship with his father – and had to face the fact and deal with it or not deal with it.

He had a clear choice.

The **elder son** straddled the fence – he tried to satisfy both his father's wishes and his own. He made no choice.

Perhaps he hoped that his father would not notice his disobedience or would excuse him later.

And that brings the story back to ourselves, and to the many people who have a foot in two camps and see no need to change. They are judged by this story, because what it is saying is that those who have a foot in two camps actually belong to none.

To put it bluntly, God prefers a prostitute who is on the road to conversion to a Sunday Catholic who ignores the values of the gospel for the rest of the week.

This story is about the two divided, conflicted sons is meant to hold a mirror up to ourselves. If we are dishonest, we will acknowledge that sometimes we are the elder son, and sometimes we are the younger.

Jesus is inviting us to put some unity into our lives – not to be satisfied with having a foot in two worlds, but to try to make the gospel the foundation of our values and all of our decisions. When we grasp what that means for us, we can begin to grow spiritually.

Question for Reflection

Is there an issue in which you are straddling the fence?

Decide today by doing God's will.





Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A life-long Catholic friend of mine recently mumbled to me, "I can't stand all these converts to the faith. They're always rocking the boat." It surprised me because he is dedicated to evangelization, and yet he struggles with openness to new Catholics. It made me realize how easily I close my heart to those whom I perceive to be outsiders who become new members of the Catholic community. Almost unconsciously I reduce the world to the categories of "us" and "them." The result is that meaningful community silently shrinks in my life. Don't we all do that to some degree?

This week Jesus' punchy parable about the two sons blows up that black and white world. One son said he wouldn't get to work, and then did. The other said he would, and then he did not. "Which did the will of his father?" asks the Lord. Like so many of us, in identifying the first as the answer, the religious authorities manifest hidden hypocrisy in refusing to follow Jesus. They — like us — intuit the correct path but simply won't do it. The tax collectors and prostitutes are indeed following Jesus and thereby getting to work in the kingdom of God. Everyone is called to do God's will regardless of the labels we may apply to them.

This week let's reject the convenient but damaging categories of "insiders" and "outsiders." Instead, let's embrace a grateful attitude that Jesus is calling fallen, weak, and broken men and women like you and me. Then we begin to see that the tax collectors and prostitutes aren't *them*. They are us. And Jesus wants all of *us* working in his boat, no matter the rocking.



Rosary

Answer:

Although a longstanding tradition attributed the rosary to Saint Dominic and the Dominican Order, the practice of using beads to count prayers predates the Dominicans by a few hundred years. In fact, it seems that what we now think of as the rosary (which means "garland of roses") was first developed by illiterate peasants and religious brothers and sisters as a way of offering 150 "Our Fathers" to replace the praying of the 150 psalms in the Divine Office.

The practice of reciting 150 Hail Marys (which was later subdivided into 15 decades of 10 Hail Marys) arose during the late Middle Ages. Devotion to the rosary began to flourish in the nineteenth century, especially as new devotions to Mary began to spread throughout Europe and the New World. An annual liturgical celebration of Our Lady of the Rosary was introduced into the Church calendar in 1573 and it has been observed on the date of October 7 since 1913.

In the apostolic letter *On the Most Holy Rosary*, Pope Saint John Paul II not only added five new mysteries to the traditional fifteen, but he also reminded Catholics that the rosary is, at its core, an opportunity to go deeper into the life of Jesus: "The rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer ... It has all the *depth of the Gospel message in its entirety*, of which it can be said to be a compendium. It is an echo of Mary's prayer, her perennial *Magnificat ...* With the rosary, the Christian people sit at the school of Mary and are led to contemplate the beauty of the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love" (no. 1).

St. Francis of Assisi | Feast Day October 4

St. Francis of Assisi (1181 – 1226) left a life of luxury for a life devoted to Christianity after reportedly hearing the voice of God, who commanded him to rebuild the Christian church and live in poverty. He founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, the women's Order of St. Clare, the Third Order of St. Francis and the Custody of the Holy Land.

Born in 1181 in Italy, St. Francis of Assisi was renowned for drinking and partying as a youth. During a military expedition/battle between Assisi and Perugia, he was captured and imprisoned for ransom. He spent nearly a year in prison and began receiving visions from God. After his release from prison, St. Francis of Assisi claimed to have heard the voice of Christ, who told him to restore the Christian Church and live a life of poverty. As a result, St. Francis of Assisi abandoned his life of luxury and became a devotee of the Catholic faith.

Today, St. Francis of Assisi, known for his deep love of nature and animals, is the patron saint of the environment and animals. Each October, many animals are blessed on his feast day.

Additionally, more than 165,000 Catholic school and religious education students are trained annually with an age-appropriate curriculum on boundary awareness and how to communicate if violations of those safe boundaries occur.
