I saw this reflection in "Living with Christ" published by Bayard Inc. and I wanted to share it with you.

The Story of Jonah: Not a Story of Whales... But Mercy

Today on the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, we will hear the only passage from the Book of Jonah that occurs in the Sunday Lectionary. What most people know about the prophet Jonah was that he was swallowed by a whale. However, the focus of the Book of Jonah is not a marine creature but rather the surpassing mercy of God.

My Will or God?

The whale swallows Jonah because he is fleeing from God. He is fleeing because God asked him to preach repentance to the Assyrians, and this is the last thing Jonah wants to do. The Assyrians were enemies of the Jews. They were a vicious conquering nation and exterminated many cultures. Jonah is afraid that if he preaches and the Assyrians repent, God would forgive them. Jonah is not opposed to mercy when it comes to himself and his own people. But when it comes to his enemies, he wants God to punish them.

This reading presents the scene where Jonah (now spewed out from the whale) finally follows God's command and preaches in the Assyrian capital, Nineveh. His worst fear is realized. The Assyrians repent, and God forgives them. **The book of Jonah ends with Jonah complaining about God's graciousness to the Assyrians.** God responds by insisting that the mercy is warranted because Nineveh is a large city containing over a hundred and twenty thousand people who are worth loving.

The story of Jonah was written by a Jew. Yet its author was willing to acknowledge the flaws of his own people. He creates the character Jonah as an uncaring nationalist, focused only on himself and showing no sensitivity for other people. God must patiently argue with Jonah in an attempt to pen his narrow mind. In this way, the inspired author ridicules the attitude of some of his Jewish contemporaries. He sees their rigidity and prejudice against other nations as contrary to the will of God.

Who Does God Side With?

God's care extends to all. The truth is clearly expressed in the reading from Ephesians that we heard back on the Solemnity of the Epiphany (January 8). Both Jews and Gentiles—that is, all humanity—are coheirs to the promise of Christ. All are welcome to receive the blessings of the Gospel.


The Story of Jonah is More Than a Fish Story

Jonah, then, is more than a fish story. It proclaims God's love for all people. In a world where terrorism and the threats of war are always escalating, we can find ourselves dividing into opposing camps and adopting an "us — versus — them" attitude. In such an atmosphere, it is easy to stereotype entire nations, characterizing some as good and others as bad, The Book of Jonah reminds us that God is beyond the issues that divide humanity. God does not take sides in the disagreements that disrupt our world. Even though we may see some people as enemies, God only sees sons and daughters to be forgiven and saved.



Gospel Meditation **Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

We start telling lies around the age of three, the experts tell us. It's understandable. Lying is a god-like power. Whatever I want, I need only say it, and the world rearranges itself accordingly. It's amazing at first. But soon reality snaps back and I'm faced with a dilemma. If I remain committed to my lie I start to fracture into pieces. My words and reality drift apart, and I find myself lost in a lonely world of further falsehoods and fear of being found out.

How marvelous, then, that Jesus begins his ministry by proclaiming: "Repent!" We tend to think it means "stop doing bad things" but it doesn't. It literally means "go beyond the mind you have." Think in a new way. It's painful to admit, but some portion of my mind is addicted to lie-telling, usually to protect my ego or make life easier. To repent means to admit this tendency, to say, "I'm done lying," and to move beyond my split mind into a complete commitment to the truth. Perhaps that's why at Mass we together proclaim, "I have sinned in my thoughts, and in my words..." Repentance and truth-telling work together.

Those who know the twelve-step process of addiction recovery know this process well. The fourth step requires radical truthtelling: listing our moral defects. This isn't being scrupulous. Rather it is freedom from falsehood, and entrance into the real world. This week, I invite you to join me in this practice. Get your phone or piece of paper. Answer the question: what are your true moral defects? Write them down. Remember, the Lord knows them already and loves you. We have a sacrament where this truth-telling is celebrated: Confession. Perhaps it is finally time to go beyond our childish lies.



Feast of St. Blaise

Liturgy 101: Ordinary Time

During these next five weeks of winter, we enter what the church calls "Ordinary Time," deriving its name from the word "ordinal," or numbered, as the Sundays in Ordinary Time are numbered. The Gospel readings for these early days of Ordinary Time center on the beginning of Jesus' ministry. It is a time in which our faith can flourish and grow — "greening"— in the spirit of this season's liturgical green color.



Musically, we return to singing "The Mass of Renewal" that was introduced last year. The Gloria is written with musical "crescendos" (growing increasing louder) and "fortes" (strong or loud) which corresponds to the flourishing and growing of the "greening" season.

The Gospel that is the focus of this liturgical year (Year B which began on the 1st Sunday of Advent) is Mark's Gospel. Mark emphasizes the identity of Jesus, the Son of God and miracle worker. It is the shortest Gospel yet it gives the most detail of Jesus' ministry—his words and deeds.

A Glimpse of Mark's Gospel

We have 3 weeks before Ash Wednesday and the start of Lent to enjoy the gospel of

Mark. So outlined below is an overview of some aspects of Mark's Gospel.

The overall plan and framework of Mark's Gospel is simple and involving. As his drama unfolds, his readers will be involved in the mystery of who Jesus is and what it means to be his follower. The Gospel develops gradually in three stages. In the first stage (chs. 1-8), Mark's readers are drawn onto a relationship with the powerful healer and preacher, Jesus of Nazareth. During the first stage, no one seems to understand Jesus' true identity, not even his disciples. Suddenly, in the encounter at Caesarea Philippi, what had been hinted at earlier (eg. 3:6: "they took counsel... against him...to put him to death") becomes clear: "The Son of Man must suffer greatly... be killed, and rise after three days" (8:31). In this first climax of his Gospel, Mark's readers also learn that the way of Christ is the way of the Christian (8:34: "Whoever wishes to come after me..."). Theirs too is the way of the cross. —Phillip Van Linden, C.M.

Perhaps one of the greatest opportunities in Ordinary Time is to make our discipleship visible not only through our words but also through our deeds. Let us, then, take the opportunity for some "greening" — flourishing and growing in our own call to discipleship.


Child sexual abusers often target nurturing, child-friendly environments, where parents and participants assume that no one would ever want to harm a child. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles began implementing the VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children sexual abuse prevention program in 2004 to send a message to potential predators that child sexual abuse is not tolerated. Through this program, adults learn that through early identification, awareness, and education they can be "proactive" in protecting children and young people from child sexual abuse. Since the program began, more than 405,000 adults have been trained in abuse prevention. Additionally, more than 165,000 Catholic school and religious education students are trained annually with an age-appropriate curriculum on boundary awareness and how to communicate if violations of those safe boundaries occur. Week of Prayer for Christian Unity January 18–25

In 1907, an Episcopalian priest and an Anglican vicar explored the

possibility of prayer for Christian Unity. The Reverend Wattson and Mother Lurana White, co-founder of the Society of Atonement, a small group of Franciscan Sisters and Friars, founded the Church Unity Octave the very next year in 1908. Representatives from the Orthodox, Protestant and Roman Catholic churches agreed in 1967 to jointly observe a time of prayer called the Week of Prayers for Christian Unity. Since 1968, the World Council of Churches and the Pontifical council for Promoting Christian Unity have collaborated annually to promote prayer for the Christian Churches.
