Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This reflection is from *Illustrated Sunday Homilies* by Mark Link, S.J.

I wanted to share it with you.

Pause and Be Still!

Today's gospel indicates that Jesus used to go off by himself to pray. One reason why Jesus did this was to renew and to recharge himself. Mark's Gospel says Jesus had spent the previous day healing people. This exhausted him spiritually.

Later on in his Gospel, Mark gives us an insight into the spiritual price Jesus paid to heal people. A woman who had been sick for 12 years pushed through a crowd to touch Jesus. When she did, she was instantly healed. "Mark says, "At once, Jesus knew the power had gone out of him." Healing people drained Jesus of power. In a similar way, working with people drains us of power. That's why we need to do what Jesus did. We need to recharge ourselves, spiritually.

Today's Gospel invites us to ask ourselves: Do we follow the example Jesus gave us in his life? Do we pause periodically to get in touch with ourselves? Do we pause occasionally to listen to God's voice in our heart? - Peace, Fr. Kevin

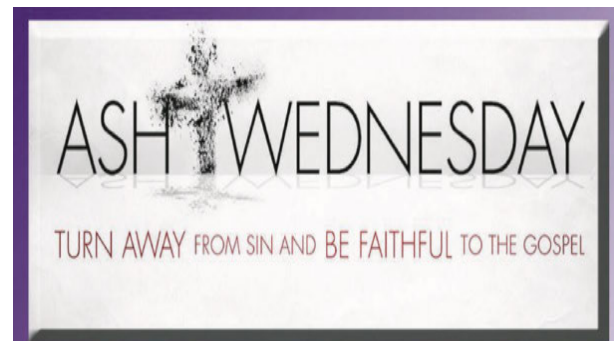

Fasting and Abstinence

When do I ...?

Fast and Abstain:

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday

Abstain:

All Fridays during Lent

Who has to ...?

Fast: Catholics who are 18 years of age, but not yet 59, are obliged

Abstain: observed by all Catholics 14 years-old and older

What is ...?

Fast: eating one full meal, as well as two small meals that together are not equal to a full meal

Abstinence: refrain from eating meat

Note: Persons that are exempt from fasting include: the physically or mentally ill, individuals with chronic illness, and those pregnant or nursing.

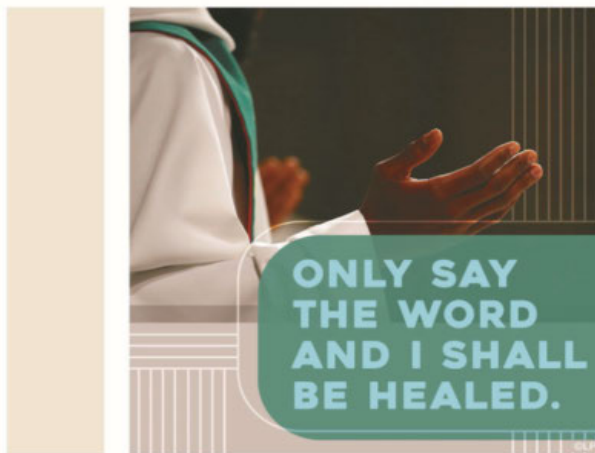
Safeguard The Children

Understanding the VIRTUS® “ Protecting God’s Children” program

Child sexual abusers often target nurturing, child-friendly environments, where parents and participants assume that no one would ever want to harm a child. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles began implementing the VIRTUS® Protecting God’s Children sexual abuse prevention program in 2004 to send a message to potential predators that child sexual abuse is not tolerated. Through this program, adults learn that through early identification, awareness, and education they can be “proactive” in protecting children and young people from child sexual abuse. Since the program began, more than 405,000 adults have been trained in abuse prevention. Additionally, more than 165,000 Catholic school and religious education students are trained annually with an age-appropriate curriculum on boundary awareness and how to communicate if violations of those safe boundaries occur. Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Maybe I'm weird, but I like spending time in doctor's offices, confession lines in churches, auto repair shops, prison cells, and support groups of various kinds. It's refreshing to be with people who humbly admit something is wrong and forthrightly set out on a path toward a solution. When we ignore what is off kilter, we become alone and fragile. In places where people are honest and hopeful about brokenness, sturdy if subtle fellowship usually ensues.

Consider the image we see of Jesus in the Gospel of Mark. **“...they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by a demon. The whole town was gathered at the door.”** The entire human community is afflicted in various ways, and so it gradually forms a strange new community around Jesus. The healer from Nazareth is like a sun of health around which orbits a throng of humanity absorbing his healing rays. These blessed souls can't fix themselves and become healthy, and they know it. But they have found in him the living source of all imaginable healing.

It's the Church, isn't it? A sin-sick community gathered and healed is what happens at the beginning of every Mass. We shuffle in through the door from everywhere and announce that we are not okay, and we can't fix it. In doing so, we are drawn into the orbit of the healing power of Christ — and into a renewed community with the whole human family. It's nothing to fear or rush. Maybe we can even learn to enjoy more how good it is to be in such a happy place.


