MODERN DAY TEMPTATIONS THAT DIMINISH OUR FIDELITY TO CHRIST

Lent always begins with the account of Jesus and the temptations in the desert. Temptations come in all shapes and sizes. Some temptations in our life are big ones. These are the temptations of sex, money, and power. Others, however, present themselves in a more subtle way. They are part of our cultural surroundings, and we can catch them like the flu through slogans, songs, and advertisements. They do not have to be right to be popular, just catchy. These are temptations that diminish our fidelity to Christ.

They come with tag lines such as "How can it be wrong when it feels so right?" That is a justification that can be pursued by serial killers and criminals of every sort. Something can be very wrong, even fatal, and still "feel right".

They come through song lyrics such as, "Whether I'm wrong or whether I'm right, I got to be me." The world's worst dictators could say the same thing. The best way to truly being ourselves is to be grounded in what is true and morally right. That is the person God created us to be.

Temptations always have a surface plausibility to them such as in the phase, "What happens in Vegas stays in Vegas."

Does it? Does betrayal of a marriage vow or actions that separate us from Christ remain in the place where they occurred, or do they travel with us like a cancer on our souls?

Phrases such as "Winning is everything" and "Looking out for Number One" can disguise a contempt for the community and network of relationships which are essential to the very life we are designed to share with others. Today, dishonesty can disguise itself as shrewd business dealings. Marital infidelity will call itself "Open Marriage." Gossip is passed along as concern for a friend. Abusive tempers can be excused as strategic or righteous indignation.

SPIRITUAL ANTIDOTES FOR TEMPTATION

To counteract these temptations, we are given the corrective and therapeutic season of Lent with its ancient medicines of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving.

FASTING is the great boot camp for our willpower. We have become accustomed to satisfying **EVERY** urge we have. Self-control must be learned. Our culture suggests that self-denial is a kind of sin. Fasting teaches us that control of the heart begins with control of the body. Fast and abstinence will teach us a great deal about ourselves and will make us strong.

PRAYER is one of the practices we all agree we should do but we never seem to have time for it. We are adept at episodic spurts of prayer, i.e. EMERGENCY SPIRITUALITY, but not a life of communion with God. We cannot, however, live our life dependent on jumper cables. We need a good battery. Prayer is the energy cell of our soul.

ALMSGIVING, the practice of sharing our prosperity with others, is one concrete measure of our commitment to Christ and His Church. **Empathy is cheap!** The TRUE TEST of our concern for the poor and people in any need is found in the memos in our checkbook. The checks we write tell the real story of our priorities.

Temptations in our life are big and small and they will not go away. They will be with us for the rest of our life like the danger of infection. They change and mutate like the seasonal flu every year. We can, however, take the spiritual antibiotics of Fasting. Prayer and Almsgiving. We need to keep these spiritual vaccinations current. Lent is a time to open our eye to the truth of our lives and begin to take corrective measures to restore our spiritual health.





GOSPEL MEDITATION -ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDER STANDING OF SCRIPTURE

February 11, 2024 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Recently I had a skin rash, and it was awful. (Please don't tell

anyone.) I am embarrassed to admit that I didn't handle it well. Complaining, whining, begging for sympathy, and crying were my responses to the merciless itching and burning. In the aftermath, a silver lining emerged. I now feel a new heartfelt sympathy for all those vexed with chronic skin problems. If you've ever had a seemingly unending skin problem, you know how that sympathy flows up from deep inside.

This gut-level compassion is something like what the Gospel describes in Jesus when the sore-covered leper says, "If you will it, you can make me clean." At this, just before the healing, Jesus was "moved with compassion." The Greek word used here is strong and earthy, closer to "his bowels and guts trembled with the deepest emotions of sadness, pity, and love." In Jesus, God heals our infirmities not from a divine distance but by learning what it feels like to be us. He acquires first-hand experience of what it costs us to be afflicted and still be faithful to God. He sympathizes with the burning, itching, and blistering of human existence in the deepest, first-hand way. To discover that is to touch Jesus' heart.

What in your life, right now, is breaking out like diseased skin? What is getting worse the more you try to soothe it? Perhaps only you feel it. Or maybe it's exposed to all. A bad habit, a broken relationship, loneliness, fear of failure, self-hatred? Name it, and then find a way to bring it confidently to Jesus who will feel what we are feeling, and thereby heal us.

Protecting God's Children® for Adults

Protecting God's Children® for Adults is training conducted by VIRTUS® certified facilitators on the prevention of child sexual abuse. The training makes participants aware of the signs of child sexual abuse, the methods and means by which offenders commit abuse, and five easy steps one can use to prevent child sexual abuse. Two videos are the centerpiece of the training: A Time to Protect God's Children™ and A Plan to Protect God's Children™. The facilitators incorporate policies and procedures into the training defining child sexual abuse, addressing the reporting of child sexual abuse, the screening and selection of employees and volunteers, and victim advocacy.

This is a 3 hour session.

Participates must arrive on time in order to be admitted to the session. All participants in Protecting God's Children and Keeping the Promise Alive Must be 18 years or older/No minors even with parents.




