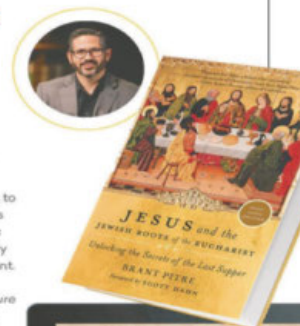

This reflection is from Celebration, March 2012 and I wanted to share it with you.

HOLDING ON TO MEMEORIES

“He was transfigured before their eyes and his clothes became dazzling white.” Mark 9:2-10

A father diagnosed with ALS (Lou Gehrig’s disease) called his children to him. “Remember when I taught you soccer and rock climbing and rappelling?

Remember when I danced at your wedding? Very soon I’ll get weaker by the day. Soon after that I won’t walk, my speech will be garbles, I’ll hardly look like myself, and soon after that I will die. I accept that; it just has to be. But I’ll still be the same person who danced at your weddings. Trust that the day will come when we’ll do more than that together again.”

We need to hold on to a vibrant memory when things seem to be going all wrong and faith pales. We need to reconnect with such a memory when something makes us doubt God’s benevolence or our connection with Him; when religion seems just plain boring; when frenetic activities and obligations make our relationship with God fade or be put on hold for later.

SCRUTINIES – 3RD, 4TH AND 5TH SUNDAYS OF LENT

WHAT ARE SCRUTINIES?

ARE “SCRUTINIES” FOR ALL OF US?

OVERVIEW

The core of the Lenten journey is “conversion of heart.” This conversion of heart not only affects our **ELECT** (the formal name of those to be baptized at the Easter Vigil,) but it also should be active in each one of us. During the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent, all parishes celebrate Rites called the “Scrutinies.”

The Scrutinies, which are solemnly celebrated, are Rites that are for self-searching and repentance and have above all a spiritual purpose. The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect. Also to bring out and strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. The Scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan; to protect them against temptation; and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. These Rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all.

Because the Elect are asking for the three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation), the Elect must have the intention of achieving an intimate knowledge of Christ and his Church, and they are expected particularly to progress in genuine self- knowledge through serious examination of their lives and true repentance. In order to inspire in the Elect a desire for purification and redemption by Christ, three Scrutinies are celebrated. Firstly, the Elect are instructed gradually about the mystery of sin, from which the whole world and every person longs to be delivered and thus saved from its present and future consequences. Secondly, their spirit is filled with Christ the Redeemer, **who is the living water**. From the first to this, the final scrutiny, the Elect should progress in their perception of sin and their desire for salvation.

SCRUTINIES AND THE BAPTIZED

We too, the Baptized, are called to do this same reflection in our own lives. We are called to reflect on our lives to uncover weakness, defectiveness, or sinful areas that need change. Once these areas are brought out and we know what they are, we can find strength, healing, and direction in the experience of the Scrutiny.

Let us reflect and pray on a portion of the Prayer of Exorcism (Scrutiny) for the 3rd Sunday of Lent:

God of power, you sent your Son to be our Savior, Grant that these Elect who, like the Woman of Samaria, thirst for living water, may turn to the Lord as they hear His word and acknowledge the sins and weaknesses that weigh them down.

DIALOGUE GOSPELS – 3RD, 4TH AND 5TH SUNDAYS.



From the third to fifth Sunday (Year A) the Lenten itinerary of the Church is marked by three major texts from John's Gospel. The Gospels for these Sundays: the Samaritan woman; the man born blind; and the raising of Lazarus, respectively are beautiful stories of Christ's love in the lives of those who believe. They remind us that Jesus is the living water that wells up into a life-giving source with each believer, the light that opens the eyes of those who were born blind, the resurrection and the life of those who believe. To help us capture some of the power of these passages from sacred scripture, we will present them in dialogue form.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

As a college student, my prized possession was an after-market car stereo. It was my pride and joy: glorious audio, eye-catching display screen, and multi-disc CD changer. It drained my hard-earned dollars, but it was totally worth it. It drenched me in music everywhere I drove. On Ash Wednesday of my senior year of college, Father Tom, the Jesuit priest at my university said, "Pray for God to tell you what he wants you to sacrifice for Lent." I did. In my heart, the answer came: "Give up listening to your car stereo for forty days." I winced. Not possible, I thought. Can't do it. I made other plans. The next morning, I was stunned to find that my car had been broken into, and my fancy stereo ripped out and stolen.

God's command to sacrifice what we love is no joke. This week in Genesis 22, God says: "**Abraham!**" "**Here I am,**" he replied. **Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, whom you love — Isaac — and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on a mountain I will show you."** Believe me, I know. We like to be in control. It chafes us that *God sets the terms* of what we must sacrifice, and how. But this is no impersonal, tyrannical process. Remember that God uses their names, Abraham and Isaac. God knows each one of us and the precious gifts He commands us to offer. Finally, our sacrifices are for our own good. Do we trust this enough to do what Father Tom asked me to do?

Lenten challenge: This week, I dare you to ask God: "What do you want me to give up?" He may ask for that which you love most. It will be something precious to you: time, money, a relationship, a dream, an opportunity. What matters is we trust Him and act sacrificially in line with His command. Whatever we sacrifice will of course come back to us as surely as the Risen Jesus — but that doesn't make it easy.
